

Raids on Anti-Soviet Group Spreading Across Country

New York, May 13.—Agents of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, acting under search warrants, have raided New York headquarters of the Russian National Revolutionary Fascist Party, headed by Andrei Vonsiatsky of Thompson, Conn. It was learned today.

The raids appeared to be the first step in a Nation-wide effort of the FBI to break up the organization, which for the first time in one of the warrants on file was accused of conspiring with Germany and Japan to overthrow the present Soviet regime.

A warrant issued by Judge Hulbert in United States District Court empowered FBI to search the rooms of the Rev. Alexander Tzuglevitch in the apartment of Mrs. H. Koroleff. Another warrant, on file in United States District Court in Brooklyn, permitted agents to search and seize records in the home of T. Savin, South Ozone Park, Queens, also described as one of the party's New York headquarters.

The warrant issued by Judge Hulbert also listed five addresses in Los Angeles, two in San Francisco and one in Hollywood as additional

"branch headquarters" of the Fascist organization. Officials of the FBI here tonight said it was probable local bureau offices in those three cities had already conducted or would conduct similar raids.

The 14-room colonial home of Vonsiatsky in Thompson was raided by agents on May 9. Tomorrow in Hartford, a Federal grand jury will begin examination of the records the FBI seized.

At the tie of the Connecticut raid, Vonsiatsky was described by the FBI as a self-styled White Russian leader in this country.
