White Russian Leader Seized on Charge of Plot Against U.S. Vonsiatsky Aprested by FBI in Rhode Island; Jury Probes Affairs

Jury Probes Affairs By the Associated Press. PROVIDENCE, R. I., June 6.—An-astase Vonsiatsky, world leader of the Nationial Russian Revolutionary Fascist Party, was arrested here to-night by agents of the Federal Bu-reau of Investigation. Dean R. Morley, special agent in charge of the Providence FBI of-Ace, said Vonsiatsky was wanted on a warrant sworn out at Hartford, Conn, charging: "Conspiracy to violate the Federal fatute on communication and trans-mission of information known to be used to the injury of the United states or the advantage of a foreign agent, and in furtherance of this conspiracy to paying on July 12, 1941 to John Doe the sum of \$2,800." Vonsiatsky was arrested on a Prov-idence street by a police detective and two F. B. I. agents, who earlier has visited his Thompson, (Conn.), method the States of the Sta

has visited his Thompson, (Conn.), home. Extradition Waived. A "fugitive" warrant was obtained here today, Mr. Morley said. Vonsiatsky waived extradition proceedings and was remanded to county jail here in default of \$25,-000 bond until Monday. Federal Judge John P. Hartigan said he would sign the removal order then. A Federal grand jury in Hartford is investigating the affairs of the \$3-year-old white Russian. The jury, which began the investigation shortly after Connecticut agents raided his Thompson estate a month ago and seized a mass of records, has made no announcement and all sessions have been private. Married Wealthy American. Vonsiatsky, a penniless emigre, maried the wealthy, socially promi-nent Mrs. Marion Buckingham Ream Stephens, 22 years his senior and a principal heiress to the huge estate of her father, the late Nor-man B. Ream of Chicago, on Febru-ary 3, 1922, in the Russian Ca-thedral of St. Nicholas, New York.
