## Dr. Westrick's Auto License Is Suspended

### Charge Perjury in Application; Baroness Guards Hitler Envoy

NEW YORK, Aug. 1 (C.T.P.S.). Official inquisitiveness into the doings of Dr. Gerhardt Alois Westrick, Hitler's American emissary—prompted, ironically, by a Good Humor ice cream sign hung out by one of his children—produced first results today. His driver's license was suspended because he had perjured himself in his application.

Commissioner of Motor Vehicles Carrol E. Mealey said Westrick had prevaricated when he stated he had no physical defects. The German agent lost a leg in the World War.

Another charge was that he had failed to notify the bureau he had changed his living quarters from the Hotel Carlyle to a secluded mansion at 188 Mamaroneck Rd., Scarsdale.

Westrick, who has been host to a number of important figures in American industry since arriving here four months ago, was directed to surrender his auto license plates and prepare for a hearing whether he should retain his driver's permit. Dr. Westrick, well guarded in his Waldorf Astoria suite by Baroness Irmingard von Wagenheim, his secretary and relative by marriage of German Foreign Minister Joachim von Ribbentrop, had nothing to say.
