Chicago Bund Leader Pleads Guilty to Spy **Conspiracy Charge**

Sentence Is Deferred Pending Trial of Four Others in Case

Others in Case By the Associated Press. HARTFORD, Conn., June 18.– Dr. Otto Williumeit, head of the Chicago division of the German-American Bund, pleaded guilty in Federal Court today to a charge that he conspired to fur-nish military and defense infor-mation to Germany and Japan. One of five persons indicted by a Federal grand jury June 10, the Ghicago physician denied the charge when first arraigned on that date and had been in jail since in de-fault of \$25,000 bonds. Judge J. Joseph Smith deferred sentencing Dr. Willumeit, a native of Germany, until after the trial of the others named as co-conspirators in the indictment. The conspiracy charge was based on the 1917 Espionage Act which carries a maximum penalty of 20 years imprisonment. Dr. Wolfgang Ebell of El Paso, Tex., another hamed in the indict-ment, arrived in Connecticut today from Texas in custody of a marshal. He pleaded innocent and bonds were fixed at \$25,000. Dr. Ebell was the third to be ar-raigned. Anastase Vonsistsky, head of the All Russian Facilita, Party, pleaded innocent on June 10. The others named in the indict-ment were Gernard Wilhelm Kunze, former head of the Band- and how a fugitive, and the Rev. Kurt Mol-zahn, Philadelphia člergyman, who is slated to be arraigned Monday.
