

# 'X-Ray' Abandons Attacks And Is Admitted to Mails

The current issue of X-Ray, a weekly newspaper facing permanent ban from the mails for alleged publication of seditious material, was admitted to the mails by the Post Office Department last night.

Solicitor Vincent M. Miles notified the postmaster at Muncie, Ind., where the paper is published by Cort Asher, that the May 9 issue was found to contain nothing prohibited by the Espionage Act.

Editions of the publication were ordered banned from the mails May 1 pending examination to determine the mailability of each. At the same time Postmaster General Frank C. Walker notified the

paper to appear for a hearing here May 19 to show cause why its second class mailing privilege should not be revoked.

"Examination of the four-page current issue of the publication . . . discloses that in said issue, it has omitted, among other things, the violent, seditious attacks against the Administration and its war methods and policies, and against various of the nations allied with this country in this war effort, which have characterized the previous issues of this publication," Miles wrote.

He stated that the issue, standing alone and without reference to the past activities of X-Ray, was mailable.
