

'American Action' Founder Arrested

CONCORD, Mass., April 26 (U.P.)—Edward Holton James, 69, of Concord, founder and head of Yankee-American Action, a quasi-political group opposed to President Roosevelt's foreign policy and America's participation in the war, was arrested yesterday on a charge of criminal libel. The charge was based on a circular called "Yankee Freemen," allegedly issued by his organization, which charged that President Roosevelt's administration is "subversive of the Yankee tradition" and that, "from the moment that he handed over the 50 destroyers to Great Britain, he day by day fomented war."
