

# CANADA SEIZES FASCIST CHIEFS

## Five Members of National Unity Party Held.

### WARRANTS FOR THREE MORE

#### Arrests Based on Sections of Law Covering Dominion Defense.

MONTREAL, May 30 (A. P.).—Five members of the National Unity party, Canadian Fascist organization, were arrested today and Royal Canadian mounted police went into the Laurentian Mountains to serve warrants on three more, including Adrien Arcand, head of the party.

Those taken into custody under defense regulations for arraignment were listed as:

Maurice Scott, leader of the party's uniformed iron guard; Henri Arcand, its national director of transport; Marius Gatién, its national director of propaganda; Paul Giguère, national adjutant of the party's legionnaires, and G. R. Barck, party organizer at nearby Ville St. Laurent.

Warrants were issued for Arcand, Dr. Noel Decarie, said to be national treasurer of the party, and Hughes Clement, provincial adjutant of the legionnaires. Dr. Decarie and Clement were believed to be with Arcand at his summer camp in the mountains.

The eight men were named in blanket charges covering arrests here and at Toronto, where Joseph C. Farr, party organizer, and John M. Lorimer, described by the po-

lice as a member of the group, were taken into custody yesterday.

The warrants were based on sections of the defense of Canada act forbidding statements tending to "cause disaffection to his Majesty the King or to interfere in any way with the success of his Majesty's forces or to prejudice their security or training, safety of the State or prosecution of war."

The charges included printing and publishing of such statements.

More than twenty homes and offices of alleged party leaders were raided last week.
