**Alleged Nazi Agent
Held Under \$25,000
Bail in Los Angeles**

Los Angeles, June 27 (AP).—Herbert Hoehne, 29-year-old German, was held under \$25,000 bond today on a charge of failing to file with the Secretary of State a registration statement showing he is an agent of the Nazi government.

Agents of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, who arrested Hoehne yesterday, refused to discuss his case, but it was learned he carried a ticket, purchased in San Francisco last Thursday, for travel by Pan American Airways to Buenos Aires.

Arraigned before a United States commissioner, Hoehne denied the charge through an interpreter and asked permission to telephone the German consulate. Officers said that instead, he called Fritz Wiedemann, German consul general at San Francisco.

Fritz Paul Van Hagan, 40, identified by county detectives as a former German intelligence officer, was arrested yesterday on a charge of illegal entry and turned over to Federal agents.
