ARGENTINE ROUNDUP

BUENOS AIRES, Argentina, June 13—Maritime police held 40 suspects incommunicado today, searching for saboteurs who placed two bombs which exploded in the holds of the British freighter Gascony, killing a stevedore and injuring five others.

Meanwhile the Interior Ministry forbade teachers and students of Cordoba Province to comment on the European situation or to criticize the Argentine government.

NICARAGUA WORRIED

MANAGUA, Nicaragua, June 13—Deputy Octavio Pasos Montiel accused a majority of the members of the Nicaraguan Chamber of Deputies of belonging to a "fifth column." When deputies protested, he repeated the charge and offered to prove that nearly all Managua newspapers were paid by the German consulate.

NAZIS IN URUGUAY

MONTEVIDEO, Uruguay, June 13— It was announced last night that the German minister to Uruguay had informed the Uruguayan Minister of the Interior that all Nazi organizations and the German Workers Union had been dissolved.
