### Hopf, Suspected of Operating a Gestapo, Take to Hills

The big parade of Nazis toward points unknown, begun by Dr. Gerhardt A. West- ick, has gained two prominent marchers: "Baron" Jochem Freiherr von Wimmersperg and Ernst O. Hopf, partners in the Yorkville Kanzlei, a travel bureau at 208 E. 88th St., and the Deutscher Handels und Wirtschafts- dienst, of 17 Battery Pl. The FBI has as- sembled evidence for the Federal grand jury hat the latter place is the New York head- quarters of the Gestapo.

At 6 a.m. Wednesday, "Baron" Wimmers- perg left his expensive apartment at 5400 Fieldston Rd., the Bronx, and drove off in his black '39 Lincoln Zephyr convertible coupe. The same morning, Hopf left his apartment in the same building, going in his gray '39 Ford convertible coupe.

Neither has been seen there since. Wim- mersperg's phone has been disconnected. Hopf's has not.

Last night, a woman member of Wimmers- perg's family visited his apartment, arriv- ing on the building bus from the IRT subway.

At the apartment house, Wimmersperg was known as a decidedly cool person, and Hopf was even less friendly.

Hopf's car is registered in New York, under his name. Wimmersperg's is registered in Westchester. Both have lived at the same apartment house for about a year.—P. R.
