

# Agents Jury Hears Chicago Printer

**Another Scheduled  
Witness Is Missing;  
Search Is Ordered**

Kurt Krouse, a Chicago printer who produced propaganda cards instigated by Nazi sympathizers, was questioned yesterday before the special grand jury on Axis agents.

Special Prosecutors William Power Maloney and John T. M. Reddan, who made quiet investigations in the Midwest over the weekend, asked law officials to search for another scheduled witness who vanished three weeks ago.

This was H. Victor von Bronstrepp, one of the lawyers for the Silver Shirt chief, William Dudley Pelley, who is scheduled to go on trial for sedition on July 28. Von Bronstrepp was grilled by the grand jurors several weeks ago. At that time he was identified as the "coordinator" of the string of subversive papers which the grand jurors have been investigating for three months.

Another witness called yesterday, but not present, was Prescott Dennett, the Washington agent for George Sylvester Viereck, the Nazi propagandist now in jail. Dennett's absence brought the disclosure that he is Private Dennett now, having been drafted a few weeks ago and sent to an Army camp in Missouri.

The grand jurors will meet again Friday.
