Among these witnesses were:
Gerald E. Winrod, who issued the magazine, Defender, in Wichita, Kans., where the Garners produced their paper, Publicity.

William Griffin, publisher of the New York Enquirer.

H. Victor Broenstrupp, Pelley's lawyer, who coordinated the policies of some of the chain of papers under investigation.

Mrs. Elizabeth Dilling, Chicago isolationist agitator, who wrote a Jew-baiting book under the name of "The Rev. Frank Woodruff Johnson." She also circulated a book about the late British Ambassador called "Lord Lothian vs. Lord Lothian," which was published under the signature of the late Senator Ernest Lundeen and published by his collaborator, Viereck.

David J. Baxter, "chancellor" of the secret, revolutionary, Social Republic Society, who warned his followers to collect arms for use in "a crisis."

Court Asher, whose paper, The X-Ray, was barred from the mails for sedition. He cleaned it up and asked for a new second-class permit.

Col. E. N. Sanctuary, head of a Fascist group in New York.

Ralph Townsend, the Japanese agent who wrote for Scribner's

Commentator and now is serving a prison term of 8 to 24 months.

Besides these witnesses there were nearly 100 others. In addition to their testimony, the grand jurors have received literally hundreds of pounds of exhibits.
