Gentlemen,

The attache at the Mexican Embassy here in Washington informs me that you can provide me with what I want.

This is it: About six months ago the Mexican government released in Mexico, to the press, a detailed account of frustrated subversive efforts of agents of the Axis powers. The statement was accompanied by extensive documentation, consisting of maps, photographs, etc.

I would like to have a copy of the statement and all the accompanying documentation. When I asked the attache about sending money and postage to you to cover the expenses he recommended that I tell you that I'd bear all expenses. Of course, I will be only too glad to do this.

Unfortunately, there is not much more information that I can give you. I realize that this may not be sufficient identification. However, it is possible that some one in your office may recall that the statement to which I refer was given considerable prominence in the American press, especially the New York City papers.

I would like the statement and documentation for use in a story I am writing.

Thank you very much for any assistance you may be able to give me.
