Dear Mr. Farwell,

The Hood College library has located copies of Who's Who through the 1968-9 edition, but not that for 1969-70.

E. Howard Hunt's office is given as that of Littauer & Wilkinson through these editions. I enclose a copy of the last of them. It was in the next one that he used the Washington Building mail drop address of The Bullen Agency.

In the copy of the 1970-1 edition he gave his office as that of a government department that was not included on the xerox due to the thickness of the book and the fact that it was at the book's gutter. If my recollection is correct, the department was the army. I believe the CIA then had a component with an army cover officed in about 1740 Penna. Ave., NW. Hunt was then still CIA and still with The Bullen Agency. The Bullen office was less than a block away from the other government office in that block.

In writing Jim Lesar I forgot to ask him if he can conveniently send you any published report that Litauer was the name of a CIA foundation.

I believe a college professor friend took David's Wise's The Espionage Establishment of which I had only one copy instead of his The Invisible Government, of which I still have the duplicate copy. If this is so I'll ask him to send you a xerox of those pages.
