Re your query of this morning, the 201 file on Lee Harvey OSWALD was opened on 9 December 1960 by CI/SIG (Ann Egarter). It was one of several files on US defectors opened in December 1960 by CI/SIG following an exchange of correspondence re defectors with the State Dept.

CI staff apparently concerns itself with redefectors to the US from the Bloc. Should there not be a central point within SR Division to keep track of defectors (at least US citizens) to the USSR?
