As I told your father, I had Helen Miller make duplicate copies of the records I got in C.A. 75-1996 to use in The King Conspiracies so they could be given to any interested editor or lawyer. She kept them se^aparate and I have just labelled and boxed them and placed them in the basement, atop the file drawer holding the FBIHQ MURKIN abstracts, K33. I do not know whether these can be of interest to you when you get to your work on the King records. I tell you in the event they may be of interest or use to you.

There are about 1,750 pages. Most are from FBIHQ 44-38861, MURKIN.

They do not include all the copies. I made some of which I made but a single copy. These additional copies are in my working set. In all we made close to 4,000 copies!

In some instances Helen may have copied records I did not have in mind, either through simple error or because my handwriting is often/illegible.

If you are not familiar with the abstracts, they are brief summaries, often limited to the first page, on a 3x5 card form. One set is in chronological order, the other, the set I have, in serial order.

There is a complete set of the notes I made during the litigation and for use in it as I read the FBIHQ MURKIN records. They are hardly what would be made for writing notes but they do call attention to some of the more interesting records.

We did not find the notes I made on reviewing the field office records. I cannot explain their absence or the lack of a copy with each relevant section, my practise then. Oddly, the same notes are missing from the set I gave Jim Lesar. Yet I have a clear recollection of having made them, even of some of the content.

If I find them I'll place them with the notes on the HQ records.

Dr. Gerald McKnight has excellent notes he made on the strike and Invaders files about which he has written scholarly articles. He is now writing a book about King-related files, those on The Poor Peoples Campaign, POCAM to the FBI. I'm sure Jerry will make available to you anything you may want.
