Relet noted that the Bureau has a definite need and responsibility to disseminate intelligence information about black extremist organizations, such as the Invaders, on a current basis. Bureau files show that the last communication from your office under the Invaders' caption was dated 6/6/69. It is noted, however, that the write-up of the Memphis inspection by Inspector W. A. Sullivan at page 32 under "Racial Matters and Informants" notes that the Invaders' headquarters is closed and no regular meetings are held.

A review of Bureau files fails to show that this information was submitted in a form suitable for dissemination. Memphis has been advised that the Department of Justice has the Invaders under consideration for possible prosecution, see letter from J. W. Yeagley, Assistant Attorney General, Internal Security Division, to the Director dated June 2, 1969, which was furnished your office on 6/4/69. It is important to the Department to be currently advised of the status of the Invaders, especially in view of possible prosecution. Memphis should immediately furnish the Bureau a letterhead memorandum on the recent activities or lack thereof of the Invaders.
