SA [redacted] was contacted on May 14, 1968, by SA [redacted] and [redacted]. Inquiry was made of [redacted] at this time regarding other occupants of the two buildings at [redacted]. It was ascertained that [redacted] is currently the only occupant of the [redacted] unit which he occupies is on the [redacted]. The last previous occupant of the unit on the first floor numbered [redacted] according to [redacted] moved in there about the first of May, 1957. [redacted] and [redacted] were both arrested on [redacted] by the St. Louis Police Department on a burglary charge for which [redacted] was briefly confined in the city jail as has been previously referred to.

[redacted] receiving a sentence of nine months probation which [redacted] believes expires in [redacted]. In [redacted] left [redacted] St. Louis, and returned to his home and the home of his parents at [redacted] with the permission of his probation officer.

With regard to the building at the rear of the building referred to above, [redacted] advised the rear building bears only the number [redacted]. It also is a [redacted] but neither of the [redacted] units on the first floor is occupied at this time. The second floor front is currently occupied by a woman named [redacted] (phonetic) and the second floor rear is occupied by a woman named [redacted].

home. This man's first name is [redacted] and [redacted] cannot remember his last name. [redacted] had originally become acquainted with [redacted] in 1959 in the vicinity of Sarah and Olive Streets in St. Louis, and he believes he introduced RAY to [redacted] in 1959. The name [redacted] which [redacted] had furnished in a previous interview as the possible name of this man [redacted] was in error, and [redacted] now is certain that the man's first name is not [redacted]. When [redacted] came to [redacted] home a few days after [redacted] had read of the robbery in a newspaper, he came by himself and was carrying a valise or briefcase, which he opened and which contained a lot of money which was strapped. [redacted] told [redacted] this money was from the bank robbery in Alton, the same robbery of which [redacted] had read in the newspaper. [redacted] told [redacted] that [redacted] and RAY had pulled this robbery. [redacted] inquired of [redacted] as to how they got by any road blocks. [redacted] told [redacted] that one of them had crossed the Mississippi River in an automobile via the Lewis and Clark Bridge into Missouri, and the other one walked across a railroad bridge over the Mississippi River, these two bridges being within view of each other. [redacted] did not tell [redacted] whether it was he or RAY who drove across the river in the automobile and did not say which one of them carried the loot. In talking to [redacted] [redacted] did not indicate that more persons than [redacted] and RAY were involved in the robbery, but [redacted] assumed that there might well have been a "wheel man" to drive the car, and he would have been in addition to [redacted] and RAY. [redacted] told [redacted] that he and RAY were not marked during the robbery but wore "tips", which [redacted] understood to mean they wore tips on their fingers which had been cut from rubber gloves. [redacted] told [redacted] that when they left the bank the police were already on the way there. During this visit [redacted] asked [redacted] how he was fixed financially and [redacted] told him "not too good". [redacted] then gave [redacted] \$250 from the valise or briefcase. This money consisted of two packages of \$1 bills totaling \$100 each, these two packages being strapped, and one \$50 bill. When [redacted] left [redacted] on this occasion, [redacted] commented that he would see [redacted] later. During this visit and their conversation, [redacted] did not indicate to [redacted] any further information regarding the whereabouts of RAY, either at this time or any other time.
