Consulting the files in my bassment where more than 40 file cabients are because I shave no other place for them, is a physical impossibility for me, in part because I cannot stand still for more than a moment to withdraw and return files, cannot squat to use them, and because my use of staris is limited and is potentially dangerous. All my files will be a free-access permanent deposit **at** in the Hood Colèege lib rary, in Frederick, Maryland. The records I obtained by Freedom of INformation Act litigation have been preserved exactly as I received them except that I have placed each volume (or section as the FBI calls them) in a file folder that bears full identification of its contents.

All records relating to abl this G FOIA litigation is filed by case number and aside from being available from the clerk of federal district court for the District of Columbia, U.S. Courthouse, Washington, D.C., are included within this archive at hood ^College.

Where it is not beyond my physical capabilities, I do include specific citations. When this is not possible for me, the text will indicate the source within this archive that, in addition to innumerable cartons total about sixty file cabinets of which the shallowest are two feet deep. Most are full. This means that the shallower file cabinets hold about eight linear feet of records standing on edge.
