

X 5357 despite the number of times the name of Agent Robert Fitzpatrick has appeared Goble withheld it under 7C as the worksheets show-even when this reports the service of a court summons on him for Jensen, attached.

X 5367 Leonard Rubin was public information Services officer for "Look Magazine. He sent the FBI tearsheets of the second look piece by "Luie, signing his name and function. Goble withheld under an alleged claim to privacy.

C 5375 although James Squires' name has appeared often enough prior to this serial, with the full account of the fake calls to and from the faker Giesebrecht, and although Squires' article was written and then picked up by AP and he co-authored a book on the case, Goble claimed the privacy exemption for withholding his name, the claim not eliminated when the name was written back in.

X 5377 2 pp unidentified report withheld 7D. *Nothing segregable?*

X 5379 throughout the already-released and publicly-known names of agents who figured publicly in this case and as professional expert court witnesses as well as those of witnesses were withheld under 7C, the claim not withdrawn when the names were written in.

| 5383 In reporting what was well reported in the papers, the filing of a petition in court, Goble has withheld the name of the petitioner, the claim to 7C remaining on the worksheets.

5386 reports surveillance on Ray, including intrusions into his legal rights and defense. The name of the source, the sheriff, was originally withheld, but not under 7D-under the privacy claim, which is not withdrawn. There is no privacy question. Suppression of the embarrassing is a more likely explanation.

5387 claims exemptions b2,7(C) & (D). It is impossible to distinguish which claim is attributed to any one withholding and thus to contest any one. Begins with resume strike history, leaders, etc.

X The names of reporters for the local papers, who signed their stories, withheld, as also date apparently is.

X Possibility Sarter is one of withheld names when all this is publicly known ^{about} him. 1st LHM definitely Sarter and McFerrin all available and in indexed books. Published widely. The name of the produce company is ^{Liberto} (phon). SAC Jensen also discussed all of this personally with the press at the time. First publication in TAME, included in Frame-Up. Some of this material from informers coincides with one of my information, uncorroborated. The address of the Pontotoc Hotel is given ~~as~~ as 69 West Pontotoc St. I remember it as having a front on S. Main. I may have this confused with the Chickasaw (approx) probably do.

X Sarter's name withheld on 28, public knowledge. 29, Sarter did drink this way and in the end the marriage broke up.

X 30 Ed Reditt's name is withheld. More than once, also that of Richmond, both public as far back as Frame-Up. Their purpose was to spy on Invaders, it says here. Known Invaders at Lorraine. 31-Black firemen transferred for security of black police intelligence officers.

X The withheld names of the black firemen have been known since the time of the crime, published often. Here it also says that the McClellan committee was the reason for the Reditt removal, by a phone call from D.C.

32 says Reditt and Richmond did not even have radio equipment. First page says what could be assumed, OPR had this.

These records prove that Clarence Kelley was lied to by the KFO after Les Payne's story appeared of he lied to Les in his letter on exactly this.

Sheriff WILLIAM N. MORRIS

[Redacted] Shelby County, Memphis, Tennessee, advised on 11-19-68 he was in receipt of information that might be of interest to the FBI. This information is as follows:

JAMES EARL RAY has advised WILLIAM BRADFORD HUIE that he thought because of recent developments there might be a different approach to his trial, but that the final decision would be left up to PERCY FOREMAN, the new attorney. RAY also requested that any payments that might be due him for attorneys fees not be sent to anyone, including RAY's brother JERRY. RAY also reportedly told Mr. HUIE that he had read an article indicating that HANES is supposedly negotiating with "Life" magazine to sell the defense file which he was going to present at RAY's trial. RAY said that if this were so it would affect to a considerable degree the story being written by Mr. HUIE. RAY suggested to HUIE that in the event he wanted to correspond with RAY again he should do so through Mr. FOREMAN.
