

Jack Ruby Movie in the Works

"Ruby," Propaganda Films' biography of Jack Ruby, will be released in February, meaning the tale of Lee Harvey Oswald's assassin will not go up against "JFK," director Oliver Stone's controversial tale of the killing of President John F. Kennedy, which opens tomorrow.

There have been reports, since denied, that Warner Bros. and Stone had been putting pressure on Propaganda not to release "Ruby" close to "JFK." "Ruby" will explore whether the Oswald killing was a mob hit and whether Ruby acted alone or was part of an FBI-CIA conspiracy.
