Last night I learned more about the 1992 law and the rights of people who request information from the JFK assassination archive.

For one thing each of us is entitled to 100 free pages, including requesting them by mail and with the Archive doing the copying. So if you have not yet ^{made} any copies, please invoke this provision of the law. I think you would then just give them the printout pages I sent you and ask them to do the copying and mail it to me.

I also learned that a person to avoid is named Tilley and that a good person there is named Roland Bordley. So, it would be best to ask for him there, Bordley.

If you do this, please ask them to return the printout pages.
