ORDER GRANTING AND DENYING IN PART SUMMARY JUDGMENT

Consistent with the views expressed in the accompanying Memorandum, and based on the Court's consideration of the public record herein and in camera review of a representative sample of withheld materials, and extrapolating from the conclusions reached with respect to the in camera items, it is by the Court this day of July, 1978,

ADJUDGED that defendant's claims of exemption are sustained with respect to all materials withheld on the basis of exemption b(1), exemption b(2), exemption b(3), exemption b(5), exemption b(7) (D), or any combination of these exemptions; and it is

ORDERED that defendant's motion for summary judgment be, and the same hereby is, granted as to all such materials; and it is

FURTHER ADJUDGED that defendant's claims of exemption are denied with respect to all materials for which no justifications have yet been filed, and all materials withheld solely on the basis of exemption b(6) or solely on the basis of exemption b(7) (F) or any combination of these exemptions; and it is

FURTHER ORDERED that plaintiff's motion for summary judgment be, and the same hereby is, granted as to all such items. Defendant is hereby ordered to disclose these items to plaintiff within sixty (60) days hereof. However, with respect to the documents for which no justifications have yet been filed, this obligation will be stayed in whole or in part pending further ruling of the Court in the event that defendant files all or some of the missing justifications within the prescribed sixty (60) days.
