Dear Dr. Rhoads:

The time for response to my C.A. 1448-75 has about expired. We have had no response, formal or informal.

As you know, I look back on a long record and history. It is consistent in a number of ways. One is in giving others what has been denied me. And by you.

I do not know what your and the government's response will be. However, also not exactly uncommon is the last-minute delivery of what I have sought.

Should this be the decision in what I seek in this action, my purpose in writing is to ask that I be telephoned and told this so that I may go to Washington to pick it up in person rather than have this or any part mailed me. What I want to avoid is a violation of my minimal rights, to equal access to that for which I alone have filed. The GSA-Kennedy estate representative contract is a case in point.
