Dear Dr. Bahmer:

I have been asked to reply to the informal inquiries which you and the Deputy Administrator of General Services, Joe E. Moody, have made to this Department concerning the authority and procedures for releasing for public disclosure certain of the documentary material that was produced or acquired by the President's Commission on the Assassination of President Kennedy (the Warren Commission).

The Commission has, of course, completed its investigation, submitted its report, and transferred all of its records, papers, and other documentary material to the National Archives for preservation. Many scholars and other persons are anxious to study that material.


Last year, the Executive departments and agencies which had furnished documentary material to the Commission developed certain guidelines for determining which of the items they had furnished could be released to the public. As a result of the applications of those guidelines, approximately two thirds of that material has been made available to the public.

Since the Commission did not provide any guidance or impose any restrictions in this regard at the time that its files were transferred to your agency, since the Commission is now out of existence, and since your agency is now the receiver and custodian of the records of the Commission, this Department believes the Administrator of General Services, acting through you and your staff, is now in the same legal and administrative position with

respect to the records, papers, and other documentary material transferred to your agency by the Commission, as the Commission was prior to that transfer.

Consequently, we believe that your agency has the authority and obligation to review that material and to determine which of it should be made available to, or withheld from, the public at this time, and to conduct subsequent reviews of such material at reasonable intervals until all of it is released. In this regard, we believe it would be appropriate for your reviews of that material to be made in conformity with the guidelines which were developed and applied by the various Executive departments and agencies with respect to the material they had contributed to the Commission. However, we do not consider those guidelines as imposing absolute standards for the release or disclosure of Commission-produced material in your custody. If in any specific case a sound legal basis exists for withholding or for releasing any such material notwithstanding provisions of the guidelines, your agency should, of course, disregard the guidelines. Similarly, if sound archival or other principles or reasons, not inconsistent with law, exist for disregarding the guidelines in some particular case, we believe that it would be appropriate for your agency to disregard the guidelines in that case. If any significant legal problem should arise in this regard, the Department of Justice will, of course, be happy to assist you in any way that we can.

NO. 3 - Any correspondence or other form of communication between the Department of Justice, the National Archives, or the Central Intelligence Agency with regard to the review of Warren Commission documents which the National Archives made in 1967 at the request of the Department of Justice.

Copies of correspondence with the CIA in 1967 regarding review of Warren Commission documents are attached. There was no correspondence with the Justice Department that year concerning review of Warren Commission documents.

Memo to the Files

A meeting was held on August 17, 1966, in the Office of Mr. Wazencraft, Assistant Attorney General for the Office of General Counsel, attended by about a dozen officials of the Department of Justice (including Messrs. Wazencraft, Reis, Simms, Slawson, Mondello, and Malley) and Bahmer, Rhoads, and Marion Johnson of NARS.

The purpose of the meeting was to discuss all important outstanding problems with regard to the records of the Warren Commission, particularly those relating to:

1. NARS' assumption of responsibility for access determinations
2. Transfer of items of evidence from the FBI to NARS
3. Review of the NARS list of recommended vesting actions and problems anticipated after vesting occurs.

The following decisions were made:

1. NARS will review the Warren Commission records and attempt to apply, on a tentative basis, the guidelines set forth by the White House for agency review of records furnished by them to the Commission; Mr. Slawson will then review these tentative determinations and will provide informal guidance and counsel with regard thereto.
2. The Office of General Counsel will send a letter to the FBI authorizing the transfer of items of evidence to NARS. Mr. Malley will then get in touch with Mr. Rhoads to make arrangements for the transfer.
3. An official of NARS (probably Rhoads) will participate in the Justice Department review of the list of items of evidence under consideration for vesting.
4. The Justice Department will attempt to work out an arrangement with the Kennedy family to permit vesting of the clothing worn by President Kennedy at the time of his assassination in return for an agreement not to permit the public exhibit of these items for a specified period of time.
5. Mr. Reis expressed an interest in trying to determine the location (and the transfer to official custody) of the autopsy photographs and X-rays.

Mr. Dooley:

We have been reviewing the records of the Warren Commission concerning which no decision has previously been made as to whether they should be made available to the public for research or withheld under the guidelines applicable to the records of the Commission. Enclosed are copies of these guidelines and of a letter of the Department of Justice concerning the obligation of the National Archives to review the records of the Commission that have not been reviewed. In order to complete the review, we need the opinion of your Agency as to whether certain records of the Commission that relate to the CIA should be withheld or made available for research.

We have prepared two lists, two copies of each of which accompany this note. List No. 1 consists of internal memoranda and other records of the Commission of which copies are enclosed. List No. 2 consists of correspondence between the Commission and the CIA, as well as a few other records, which should be available in the files of the CIA relating to the Commission's investigation.

We shall appreciate it if you will mark one of the copies of the two lists in the column on the right side of the page with the word "Release", if in your opinion a document can be released,

of the number of the guideline under which it should be withheld,
and return the marked copy to us.

Some of the documents on these lists also relate to or
were originated by other agencies than the CIA, particularly
the State Department and the Federal Bureau of Investigation.
If the CIA has no objection to the release of these
items, we would, of course, obtain a clearance also from
the other agencies concerned when this is necessary.

Dear Mr. Director:

In a letter of February 8, 1965, I requested an expression of the views of your agency with regard to public disclosure of unpublished documents that were furnished to the President's Commission on the Assassination of President Kennedy by your agency.

Following a review of the recommendations of your agency and of officials of other interested departments and agencies, I submitted a memorandum to McGeorge Bundy, Special Assistant to the President, proposing certain guidelines for determining which of those documents should be made available to the public. By a memorandum of April 19, 1965, Mr. Bundy approved those guidelines and asked me, in coordination with the National Archives, to instruct the appropriate agencies to conduct a review of pertinent documents in accordance with those guidelines and to complete that review by September 1, 1965.

In order to facilitate this review, the National Archives has prepared a list of the documents which are in the files of the President's Commission and which were submitted by, or originated in, your agency. This list includes only the documents that were not published by the Commission and those that could readily be determined to have been published only in part.

It is requested that you arrange for the prompt examination of the listed documents with a view to authorizing the removal of existing restrictions on public

availability of as many of those documents as possible. The guidelines approved by Mr. Bundy, which are set forth in the attachment to this letter, should be applied in making the required determinations.

The document-by-document review that this procedure requires may be undertaken on the basis of file copies of documents which were retained in the files of your agency, or, since all records of the President's Commission have been transferred to the National Archives, the Archivist will arrange to give your representative access to the listed documents if that procedure would be more convenient. At the conclusion of your review, a copy of the enclosed list, marked so as to show which documents may be made public and which must remain closed for the time being, should be sent to Dr. Wayne C. Grover, Archivist of the United States. With respect to items that must be withheld from the public, please indicate the letter or number of the item in the attached guidelines that best describes your agency's reason for such withholding.

It is essential that the Archivist of the United States receive your reply by August 15, 1965, since a report to the White House must be prepared and submitted by September 1 on the overall status of accessibility to the records of the Commission. If any questions or problems arise in the course of the review, your representative should contact Dr. James B. Rhoads, Assistant Archivist for Civil Archives, whose telephone number is coda 13, extension 22442.

I am aware of the difficulties inherent in this undertaking, but the public interest in these documents, and the determination of the White House Office that

they be disclosed to the fullest extent consistent with the national security, sound public administration, and the rights of individual privacy, require that this assignment be accomplished with care and dispatch.

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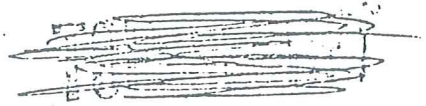
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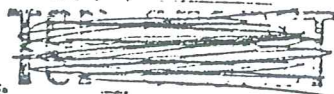
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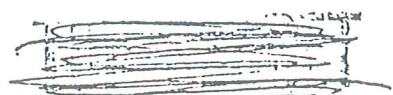
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
