In his just published book, "The Stronge Case of James Barl vey", Clay Plair, Jr., expresses his gretitude for the information and assistance gives him by your bureau.

I have written a book including the Rmy case, and I would like to be ble to include any information that might be missing.

Therefore, I write to sak for what hes been given Mr. Hisir and perhaps other writers and say other data you might properly give me.

Now that there has been a court proceeding, - hope some of what might earlier have been chasidered secret is no longer. I am particularly interested in that evidence that establishes or tends to establish that Rey was the assessin, such things as the ballistics proof. Because there are ac many contrary indications, I would also appreciate proof that he harbored recial enimosities. And with the existing indications of the involvement of more than one person, for example, evidences that while Ray was in California someone acting for him was in Alabama, I would particularly like to know what persuaded your bureau that he was entirely alone. Ray and members of his family say he was not alone, as - interpret their statements.

Four buresu has also released some pictures. I would appreciate copies. Possibly you have pictures you may not properly give me, those taken by photographers at the moment of the crimes. I would like references to those taken as close as possible to the moment of the crime and at its scene.

My purpose in seeking this information is to make my work as complete and accurate as possible. Because what was earlier evailable persuades that Pay was not alone and probably was not the assessin, I am quite anxious to have all the evailable proofs that there was no conspiracy and that he was the assessin.
