Dear Mr. McCreight:

By letter dated March 31, 1978, Mr. Quinlan Shea, Jr., Director, Office of Privacy and Information Appeals, U.S. Department of Justice, announced a decision that records of the Department of Justice compiled pursuant to the investigations of the assassinations of President Kennedy and Dr. King should be furnished to my client, Mr. Harold Weisberg, without charge. In his letter, Mr. Shea also stated that his determination that search fees and copying charges should be waived is to apply retroactively. (A copy of Mr. Shea's March 31, 1978 letter is attached hereto)

In accordance with Mr. Shea's fee waiver determination, I request that you refund the monies which he has paid to the Federal Bureau of Investigation to obtain records in its files on the assassinations of President Kennedy and Dr. King.
