Dear Mr. Weisberg:

Enclosed herewith are the documents which contained information that had been received from the U.S. Department of State and were referred to that agency for review.

Of the 23 documents referred, 17 are being released in their entirety, 5 are being released in part, and 1 is being withheld, in accordance with the recommendations obtained from the State Department.

In the documents in which deletions have been made, the following subsections of Title 5, United States Code, Section 552, have been applied:

- (b) (6) materials contained in sensitive records such as personnel or medical files, the disclosure of which would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of personal privacy;
- (b)(7) investigatory records compiled for law enforcement purposes, the disclosure of which would:
  - (C) constitute an unwarranted invasion of the personal privacy of another person;
  - (D) reveal the identity of an individual who has furnished information to the FBI under confidential circumstances or reveal information furnished only by such a person and not apparently known to the public or otherwise accessible to the FBI by overt means.
