The Barclays Bank slip, copy of which was received from Memphis, has been reexamined by Chief Inspector [redacted] and Sgt. [redacted], New Scotland Yard. Both officers state they remember the slip being in subject's property at the time of his arrest.

[redacted] checked with Barclays Bank at London Airport on 8/15/68 and the following information is known:

The bank is located in the terminal building opposite the exit for passengers arriving in the country after they have cleared Immigration and Customs.

The primary function of this branch of the bank is to change foreign currency into English currency for travelers arriving in England.

The date stamp on the slip indicates the date of the transaction, which in this case is 5/17/68, the day RAY arrived in England from Lisbon. The word "Europa" on the stamp indicates in which terminal at London Airport the bank is located, Europa being the departure and arrival building for European flights.
