registration card, all of which are official police records in Portugal; and [REDACTED] a Portuguese clerk in the [REDACTED] Embassy, [REDACTED] who issued a passport to the subject to correct the misspelling of his name from SNEYA to SNEYD during his visit there.

The Portuguese Police were extremely cooperative again in connection with the inquiry and it appeared that DWYER and his associates were completely satisfied with the treatment afforded them.

Representatives of the American Embassy, Lisbon, were also contacted and were likewise completely cooperative.

DWYER requested that I address to him a letter advising as to the exact procedure necessary to obtain both [REDACTED] as witnesses in the United States in the event such is found to be necessary during the trial. This has been done and a copy of this letter is enclosed for each the Bureau and Memphis.
