It would be advisable for you to stipulate the financial arrangements in the communication. At the same time, it is suggested that you advise our Memphis Office so that I can be advised expeditiously through Bureau channels in order that I can inform the second personally at the same time that you are advising the Embassy in Lisbon.

Insofar as is concerned, it would be necessary, according to the Canadian Embassy in Lisbon, for you to direct a communication to the U.S. Department of Justice requesting that an invitation be issued to Mrs. through the U. S. Department of State to the Canadian Foreign Office:
