(4) By letter dated September 17, 1977, (A copy of which is attached hereto as Exhibit B) plaintiff requested copies of certain items from the Birmingham, Chicago, Atlanta, Los Angeles, and New Orleans Field Offices. The items selected by Mr. Weisberg are circled in red on the above-mentioned letter (Exhibit A).

(5) By letter dated October 21, 1977, plaintiff was furnished a copy of all releasable material from the Birmingham Field Office. The inventory worksheets for those documents reflect that the items specifically requested by Mr. Weisberg in his letter of September 17, 1977, were included in that release. Attached as Exhibit C are copies of the above-mentioned disclosure letter and one page of the Birmingham inventory worksheets on which those items listed in plaintiff's letter are circled in red. These circled items correspond directly to the circled items under the Birmingham listing on page 1 of the enclosure to Exhibit A.

(6) By letter dated October 26, 1977, plaintiff was furnished a copy of all releasable material from the Chicago Field Office. The inventory worksheets for these documents reflect that the items specifically requested by Mr. Weisberg in his letter of September 17, 1977, were included in that release. Attached as Exhibit D are copies of the above-mentioned disclosure letter and two pages of the Chicago inventory worksheets on which those items listed in plaintiff's letter are circled in red. These circled items correspond directly to the circled items under the Chicago listing on pages 1 and 2 of the enclosure to Exhibit A.

(7) By letter dated October 19, 1977, plaintiff was furnished a copy of all releasable material from the Los Angeles Field Office. The inventory worksheets for those documents reflect that the items specifically requested by Mr. Weisberg in his letter of September 17, 1977, were included in that release. Attached as Exhibit E are copies of the above-mentioned disclosure letter and five pages of the Los Angeles inventory worksheets on which those items listed in plaintiff's letter are circled in red. These circled items correspond directly to the circled items under the Los Angeles listing on pages 2 and 3 of the enclosure to Exhibit A.

(8) By letter dated October 17, 1977, plaintiff was furnished a copy of all releasable material from the New Orleans Field Office. The inventory worksheets for those documents reflect that the items specifically requested by Mr. Weisberg in his letter of September 17, 1977, were included in that release. Attached as Exhibit F are copies of the above-mentioned disclosure letter and three pages of the New Orleans inventory worksheets on which those items listed in plaintiff's letter are circled in red. The circled items correspond directly to the circled items under the New Orleans listing on page 4 of the enclosure to Exhibit A.

(9) By letter dated October 20, 1977, plaintiff was furnished a copy of the material processed from the Atlanta Field Office. The inventory worksheets for those documents reflect that Mr. Weisberg was also furnished the bulky exhibit SF-2, which contained newspaper clippings, as he requested in his letter of September 17, 1977. Attached as Exhibit G are copies of the above-mentioned disclosure letter and one page of the Atlanta inventory worksheets on which SF-2 is listed.



Based on our communications with plaintiff and the inventory worksheets for the Atlanta Field Office, there is no evidence that plaintiff was specifically advised of the status of the remaining three items he listed in his September 17, 1977, letter, bulky exhibits 1B1, 1B2, and 1B4.

Bulky exhibit 1B1 is a Delta Air Lines computer printout. Plaintiff in his letter of September 17, 1977, (See Exhibit B) stated, "The Delta computer printout: I do not want all of it. Presuming this relates to the passengers who left the plane at Memphis and did not return. I would like copies of the other records relating to this, including any from any other field office." The FBI interpreted this to mean that plaintiff did not want the computer printout itself, but wanted the results of any investigation stemming from the names and addresses in the printout. Investigative material regarding any leads generated by the names on this printout would have been included in the investigative files which were processed and released to plaintiff.

Bulky exhibit 1B2 contained several items of evidence including some maps and newspapers. Mr. Weisberg requested that he be furnished copies of the maps and newspapers. Upon further research, it was found that all the articles in 1B2 were forwarded to FBIHQ laboratory in April, 1968. There is no documentation that this material was ever returned to the Atlanta Field Office. A recent search of that office failed to produce this exhibit. It appears that Mr. Weisberg was mistakenly informed that these items were still maintained in Atlanta. Pursuant to the Court-ordered second Administrative Review of the MURKIN material, Mr. Douglas F. Mitchell, Attorney-Advisor in the Office of Privacy and Information Appeals, United States Department of Justice checked FBI work copies and concluded that these items were probably processed as



a part of the Headquarters file. (See pages 4 and 5 of the Affidavit of Douglas F. Mitchell dated April 19, 1979.)

Bulky exhibit 1B4 contains enlarged maps of Atlanta and Los Angeles. Mr. Weisberg requested copies of the Atlanta map only. A search of our records during the above-mentioned second Administrative Review revealed that this map of Atlanta was never retrieved from the Atlanta Office for release to plaintiff. At that time, this map was forwarded to FBIHQ and arrangements were made for Mr. Mitchell to provide it to plaintiff. However, inasmuch as Mr. Mitchell has since resigned his position with the Department of Justice, the map of Atlanta is attached hereto as Exhibit H.

(10) The attached letters and inventory worksheets have been included not only for the Court's assistance in determining that the FBI did respond to plaintiff's letter, but also to assist plaintiff in locating this material in the voluminous amount of records which he has been provided.

Dear Mr. Kelley,

In your letter of the 14th, received today, you are helpful in providing a list of items not copied by various field offices in order to save me unnecessary copying cost. I do appreciate this. However, this letter and its attached list illustrate that the improper withholdings about which I have long complained without ever receiving an adequate response are also costly to me. I will be asking for prints of pictures that, if I had the relevant other records in hand and not expurgated, I might not want. What may be less apparent to you but should be well understood by your assistants in that other costs from these unjustifiable withholdings, like the waste of time, are important to me.

I assume that either with the photographs or separately and in a manner that permits easy correlation with the photographs I will receive the relevant other records. In the past I have received copies of photographs from which the legends added to the back are missing. I would appreciate a xerox of the back of each photograph with any information added to that photograph, with the xerox attached to the back of the photograph by any means convenient to your assistant, like magic tape or masking tape.

I would like the following from the list attached to your letter:

Birmingham - 1(a), Exhibit 1-4-69, the magazine "Redfield '68," all; (b) the magazine "Winchester-Berington 1968 Sporting Arms Ammunition," those pages relating to the Gamenaster rifle in question and any pages relating to the .30-06 ammunition in question. 2. The magazine titled "Way of Figs." I would like all, please.

Chicago - most of the listed Serials are pictures of James Earl and Jerry Ray. I would like copies of the relevant records in order to know whether I want copies of any of the photographs or which ones. I do not want the Serials relating to laundry marks.

Atlanta - SF-2 - Harbin newspaper clippings. If the number of pages is not great I would like a copy of all these clippings rather than indicate a subject preference that might mean more work for the FBI. By this I mean if the reference to Volumes 1-4 that follows refers to these clippings and if they are about the thickness of those HQ and Memphis volumes, I would like them all. If there are fewer then of course I want all. The person subject to polygraph is not indicated. Before deciding I would like the relevant other records. The Delta computer printout: I do not want all of it. Presuming this relates to the passenger who left the plane at Memphis and did not return, I would like copies of the other records relating to this, including any from any other field office. Rather than take time if Item 44-2386-1B - maps - newspapers is not thick I'll appreciate copies. If it is thicker than the average Section I would appreciate knowing what maps and what newspapers. Assuming these to be those said to have been James Earl Ray's, I would want copies together with the relevant records on how they were obtained and by whom. 1B-4, I would like the enlarged map of Atlanta only. I do not want 1B-5 There is no mention of 3.

The Los Angeles items include names withheld from the records that have been provided, name withheld to now despite my prompt protest that the withholding was improper. Under these circumstances I believe it is not asking too much to ask that those ~~of which this is true~~ be provided without cost to me together with copies of the relevant records from which there were the obliterations complained about. However, I am not now raising a special issue of this. With regard to the photographs of the Rays I repeat what I state above. I also would appreciate an explanation of the numbers missing in what appears to be the sequential allocation of numbers. In the list of numbers that follows I ask again that the information included on the backs be provided as asked above together with the relevant other records: 1a4-1a8 (here and below inclusive), 1a11, 1a12, 1a13, 1a29-32, 1a34-45, 1a48 (described as "negative" and print desired, 5x7 or 8x10, whichever is easier for the Los Angeles office), 1a55-69, 1a71, 1a90, 1a100, 1a104, 1a106, 1a109. There is no picture of Marie Martin listed. If there is one I'd like a print.



Investigation subsequent to the receipt of this information failed to either locate or positively identify the party who made this call. Therefore, there does not appear to be any pertinent information regarding James C. Hardin, other than that furnished by Allen Thompson.

A review of the Headquarters Murkin file and the Memphis Field Office Murkin file has located only three sets of crime scene photographs. These are 48 photographs from the Memphis Police Department, 53 photographs taken by Special Agents Kearney and Fitzpatrick, and 15 photographs which were furnished by the Shelby County District Attorney's Office. The 15 photographs received from the District Attorney's Office appear to be duplicates of some of those received from the Memphis Police Department. We have been unable to locate any additional crime scene photographs, nor have we located any record which indicates that photographs

In addition, as a matter of administrative discretion, any documents which were found to be exempt from disclosure under the Privacy Act were also processed under the provisions of the FOIA. Through these procedures, you have received the greatest degree of access authorized by both laws.

You have thirty days from receipt of this letter to appeal to the Deputy Attorney General from any denial contained herein. Appeals should be directed in writing to the Deputy Attorney General (Attention: Office of Privacy and Information Appeals), Washington, D. C. 20530. The envelope and the letter should be clearly marked "Freedom of Information Appeal" or "Information Appeal."

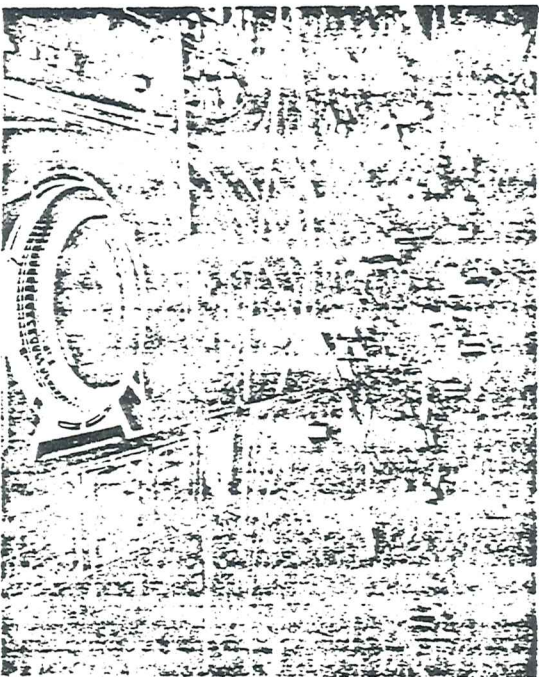

Showing: POSTAL ZONES POINTS OF INTEREST EXPRESSWAYS WITH STREET INDEX

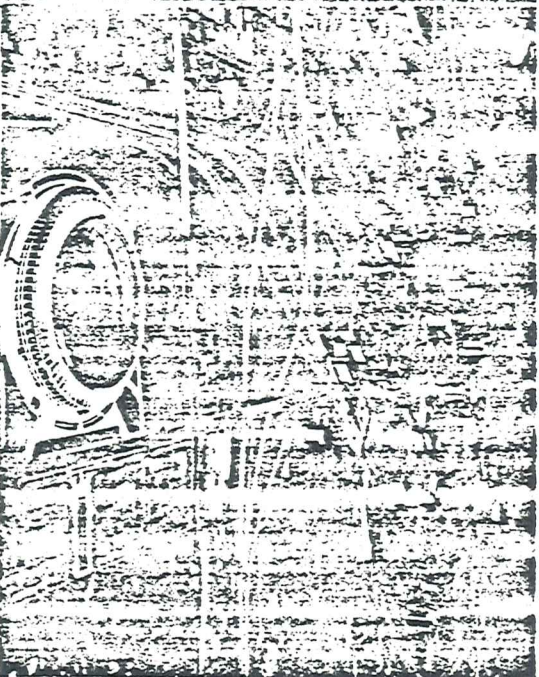
