AFFIDAVIT OF HORACE P. BECKWITH

- $\label{eq:continuous} \textbf{I, Horace P. Beckwith, being duly sworn, depose}$ and say as follows:
- of Investigation (FBI) assigned in a supervisory capacity to the Freedom of Information-Privacy Acts (FOIPA) Branch, Records Management Division at FBI Headquarters (FBIHQ).

 Pursuant to my official duties, I am familiar with Plaintiff's Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request of the United States Department of Justice, Office of Professional Responsibility (OPR) for the appendix material compiled during the review by OPR of the investigation of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. by the Department of Justice (DOJ) and the FBI.
- a review to be conducted by the Atlanta Office, FBI of the file pertaining to the assassination of Dr. King.

 I specifically requested a review of the material furnished the FBI by the Atlanta, Georgia Police Department. I was informed that 29 pages of documents are received by the FBI in Atlanta from the Atlanta Police Department.

 These documents are included in the FBI file on the assassination of Dr. King and are specifically located in Atlanta file number 44-2336, Serial 1215. The police department transmitted these documents to the FBI in confidence and for investigative assistance during the investigation

of Dr. King's assassination.

The transmittal and free flow of information by the FBI and local law enforcement agencies are critical for effective law enforcement. The documents referred to above were provided in confidence with the clear understanding that the FBI would insure their confidentiality. To now disclose this information would greatly inhibit the cooperation between local and federal agencies. These avenues of cooperation are essential and protection of documents, such as those provided by the Atlanta Police Department, is consistant with the spirit and intent of the FOIA. Various local law enforcement agencies have expressed their concern to the FBI about releases of their records to the public after these records were confidentially furnished. Any such release will affect future frank and candid exchanges of information between agencies.
