You will recall, I am sure, a mosting between Secret Service officials, including you, and me in relations to my FOIA interests in the JFK assassination.

Then and on other occasions, in person and in writing, I was assured that all Secret Service records on this subject had been turned over to the "ational Archives and would be provided to me by it.

If your own recollection is not clear on this and if your files are not & I suggest you check the files of Assistant Director Tom Kelley.

In having adopted the Secret Service word I appear to have been decrived. As a result records I would have had have not been provided to see and have been made available to others.

Under the provisions of FOIA I am making the serquest I was deceived into not making of the Secret Service when I was assured it had no relevant records it had not made available to me through the Mational Archivas.

It is for any and all records, regardless of form, origin by or date, on or in any relating to the assaudination of President Kennedy.

I expect that in this you will provide equality of access to me and that you will provide me immediately with any such records already provided to others. With regard to any such records there of course is no need for a search, hat having been performed.

I deeply and sincerely regret the accumulation of reasons to believe the Secret Service, whose obligation was to prevent harm to him, has been neither honest nor forthright with regard to records relating to the assassination of President Kennedy and to those who have expoused a view other than the Secret Service's on that orime.
