Dear Counsel:

Your case is approaching the point at which it will be calendared, in its regular turn, during the first few months of the September 1978 term.

It is our experience, due to the time between filing briefs and calendaring, that changes may occur in the status of related cases, or in the addition of new related cases, which may have a bearing on calendaring. I am writing, consequently, to inquire whether your related case statement should be brought up to date. For example, (1) is there pending here any case which relates to this one, (2) are there pending proceedings in the District Court which are related, (3) if this is an agency matter, are there related proceedings before the agency and (4) is there any case pending before the United States Supreme Court which may affect the disposition of this case. The Court is also interested, although this may not affect the calendaring of cases, whether there is any change in the related case statement as it applies to pending cases in other courts of appeals.

There is no necessity to respond if there is no change to report on the status of related cases. It would be useful if counsel confer and designate one attorney to respond, if there are changes to report. A response by July 28 will be appreciated.
