## MOTION FOR LEAVE TO FILE LEGAL-SIZE APPENDIX

Comes now the appellant, Mr. Harold Weisberg, and moves the Court for leave to file a legal-size appendix for the following reasons:

- This case has been consolidated with Weisberg v. General Services Administration, Case. No. 77-1831. The appendix in that case is legal-size and was routinely accepted by the Clerk's office at the time it was filed.
- The originals of most of the documents in this case are legal-size. In order to reproduce them on letter-size paper they must either be re-typed or photo-reduced at greater cost to appellant. Photo-reduction also diminishes legibility and re-typing is timeconsuming.
- 3. Appellant's many Freedom of Information Act lawsuits have forced him to expend thousands of dollars on xeroxing costs alone.

Because appellant's income is both minimal and erratic, this has imposed an enormous burden on him. Under these circumstances, he should not be compelled to incur additional expenses.

Accordingly, appellant requests that he be permitted to file a legal-size appendix.
