



3. On October 11, 1978, the Central Intelligence Agency informed the Department of Justice that the two documents had been declassified and would be released to the Appellant as soon as possible. On October 13, 1978, the General Services Administration, the Defendant-Appellee in this action, informed the Department of Justice that, in view of the CIA's position, it no longer wished to contest the release of the documents.

4. As a result of these communications, the Department of Justice has concluded that the appeal in No. 78-1731 is completely moot and that no useful purpose would be served by continuing to litigate the question of whether the District Court should hold a new trial on the issue of access to documents which are now publically available.

For the foregoing reasons, the Defendant-Appellee respectfully requests this Court to extend the time for filing its brief in No. 78-1731 until seven days after the Court acts upon its Motion for a Partial Dismissal of the Appeal in No. 77-1831 and for a Complete Dismissal of the Appeal in No. 78-1731.
