Dear Ms. Dolan.

As you may recall, your "eply "emorandum in C.A. 77-1997 was delayed in reaching Jim Lesar. The copy he made for me was, of course, further delayed in meaching me. I have read it.

Mr. tesar is currently confined to bed with a flu-like illness. Prior to illness he was so far behind in his work that he had not been able to read and file affidavits I Provided, including one dated before your "eply "emorandum correcting an error I had made. When he is able to work he will be even farthur behind. I therefore write you directly, not knowing what time considerations may be involved.

You make selective quotation of a transcript from C.A. 77-0592. The selection is so selective that you have emitted the part that states the opposite of the interpretation you have placed on the transcript. This is on page 22. Despite the extensive footnoting you here limit your citation to a single page, 42 and describe it as the "pertinent part." This, I believe, makes your use a misrepresentation.

You also state of me what I regard as untruthful and unfactual. You provide no proof. In context I regard this as defamatory. I cannot and I do not accept this in silence. I regard this kind of misuse of process as neither necessary nor justified in the ethical practise of adversary law. I believe it is even more improper when a woman who is in official capacity does this with a man who is aging and not in the best of health.

Were this an isolated instance it still would require response. However, it is by no means new in your Division. It has become your Division's practise. Recently your superior in effect called as a crook, accusing me of trying to defrend the government when the exact reverse is the actuality. He did this in an unusually manner, not sending me a copy and sending one to the judge. In this he was not much in excess of what I regard as your Division's practise for at least the past name months in what I regard as a consistent effort to defame me and underwinegray reputation and that of my work.

If I had any reason to believe that what you and your Division have done is accidental I might expect voluntary rectification from you. Because I have no reason to believe any of this is other than intended and because of Mr. becar's present situation I thinker make a record between us. I will not be able to see Mr. becar for another 10 days. I am informing him by a cabon copy.

Attached to your Keply Mamorandum is Charles Savige's affidavit of the same date, July 19. I have written Mr. Savige informing him that I believe his affidavit is falsely sworm, again because of Mr. Lesar's present situation and possible time considerations.
