About 9:30 PM, on the night of the assassination of Dr. Martin Luther, Jr., I saw a white convertable 1967 "Wildcat" with a Clarke County Wississippi tag number 120-134. This car passed me on South Prentiss (in Jackson, Mississippi). We were both treveling South; this car turned Fest on Central Street, and so did I. The next turn was South on Eastview Street, after our turn on Eastview Street, this wildcat abruptly stopped and parked.

As soon as I passed, this car turned completely around and hereed in the opposite direction.

This car may not be in any way connected with the crime that took place in Memphis 2 to 3 hours earlier, but it was on my mind and it bothered my conscience.

If you think it will help in solving the case of the uncaught killer please check it out.
