(MARGO) TILDEN, 85 Yarrow Street, Lakewood, Colorado, advised, after unsuccessful attempts to locate her on November 27 and 28, 1963, that she had lived in the State of Texas for the greater part of her life and that she was formerly employed as a hostess at the Keyboard Club, 8030 Long Point Road, Houston, Texas, from about 1961 to February, 1963. She stated that in the past she has also appeared as an acrobatic dancer at some clubs in Houston but never in Dallas, Texas. She stated that she is not acquainted with JACK RUBY and has never met him. She added that she saw a man one time in the Keyboard Club, Houston, who somewhat resembled RUBY but that she could not say it was he.

Mrs. TILDEN stated she may have mentioned to someone that she knew JACK RUBY but that she in fact did not.

She stated further that she is a good friend of President LYNDON JOHNSON and then subsequently during the interview'stated that she had not in fact met Mr. JOHNSON but had seen him on occasions.

Mrs. TILDEN stated further that she was not in sympathy with the late President KENNEDY's foreign policy and that she did in fact feel sorry for LEE HARVEY OSWALD because he was a mixed-up boy. She repeated again that she does not now nor has she ever known JACK RUBY and she could furnish no information about him.

She was working amateur shows and worked a one show nightly for RUBY until about April, 1963, arriving at club few minutes before her act, and leaving immediately afterwards.

She stated she knew him only as employer and had no knowledge of his past or present activities, associates, political sentiments, law-enforcement contacts or acquaintance with LEE HAR-VEY OSWALD.

She had no personal association with him and his political sentiments, contacts with law enforcement or acquaintance with LEE HARVEY OSWALD were unknown.

JAN HUMPHNEY, also known as Mrs. Jack Humphney, 1020 Pennsylvania Street, Denver, former dancer at Club 400, Denver, known as "Jan Tabor" stated she was working amateur shows in Dallas in December, 1962, and went to Carousel Club on a Friday night and asked for a job. RUBY asked her to come to his apartment at unrecalled address in Oak Cliff section and he would hire her as a professional dancer. She went to his apartment and he made "perverted sexual advances" to her. She explained this perversion by stating that he only wanted to rub against her leg, which she would not agree to and that he did not insist on or propose sexual intercourse. She signed a six-month contract at \$90.00 per-week for three shows nightly. After working about ten days she became ill and was off for a week and was fired. She has had no subsequent contact with RUBY and knows nothing about his associates, activities, political sentiments, lawenforcement contacts or acquaintance with LEE HARVEY OSWALD.

JOHN MC GILL, rancher, advised he employed HAROLD PEDEN approximately 1947 to 1949. He described PEDEN then as a young farm boy who was a very good worker, but lacked intelligence.

He advised in approximately 1949, PEDEN married a prostftute, DONN, last name unknown. PEDEN left ranch in 1949, to get other employment, and about one year ago, PEDEN wrote a letter to MC GILL which MC GILL and wife could not understand because the text meant nothing to them as PEDEN wrote about things unfamiliar to them. At that time PEDEN was possibly mentally unbalanced and in need of psychiatric treatment. MC GILL feels PEDEN now trying to get some publicity.

In the summer of 1948, MC GILL met JUAN, last name unknown, eighteen years old, five feet eight inches tall, weighing 150 pounds, brown eyes, in a local bar, Laramie, Wyoming. Was wealthy and was from Columbia, South America, where his parents were wealthy farmers and had other relatives high in government circles. JUAN had attended two or more universities in United States on scholarships and was attending the University of Wyoming. JUAN was a good looking individual who liked to wine and dance women and often got into fights.

In view of his drinking and fighting, JUAN had a chauffeur and bodyguard whose name was JACK KATRICIAN (phonetic), correct spelling unknown. KATRICIAN was about thirty-five years of age, six feet tall, two hundred pounds, and in 1948, had a brother, name unknown, who was a tackle or guard on Washington Redskins Football Team.

MC GILL invited JUAN and KATRICIAN to his ranch, where they visited two or three times that week.

JUAN liked the United States and never made any statements against it. MC GILL never saw KATRICIAN carry a gun, although he mentioned he could carry one so long as he was bodyguard for JUAN. KATRICIAN made no statements against the United

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States, and MC GILL has no additional background. JUAN apparently " attended several universities because he was dismissed from them because of his drinking and love life.

MC GILL stated he has seen photographs of RUBY on television and in the papers and said KATRICIAN is not identical with RUBY.

MC GILL stated KATRICIAN impressed him as "a big stupid dumb person."

Mr. JAMES R. CAMERON of 5852 Clendenin, Dallas, Texas, telephone DAvis 7-4258, employed by McCord Music Company, Dallas, was interviewed at the home of an acquaintance, ROBERT E. LEE WILLIAMSON, 132 Cornell, Widefield, Colorado, where CAMERON and his wife are visiting for the holidays.

CAMERON advised he is acquainted with JACK RUBY only insofar as he has been a customer at the Vegas Club operated by RUBY. He stated he does not know RUBY personally and has never met or seen, to his knowledge, LEE HARVEY OSWALD. He stated that in conversation with the WILLIAMSONs, he speculated that RUBY might have a syndicate connection but had no definite information of any kind regarding this.

Mr. MORRIS RUTLAND, 525 University Building, Denver, advised that he is an attorney-at-law, and that he resides at 300 Elm, Denver, Colorado.

Mr. RUTLAND continued that he is a first cousin of JACK L. RUBY of Dallas, Texas. He elaborated by stating that his father was a brother of RUBY's mother. He continued that he is not positive that he has ever met JACK RUBY and has definately had no contact with him for the past twenty years.

RUTLAND advised that he has kept in contact with MARIAN CARROLL of Chicago, Illinois, sister of JACK RUBY, and that she has visited in his home in Denver, Colorado, several times, the last time being in September, 1963.

He advised further that he and his wife invited MARIAN CARROLL to attend his son's Bar Mitzvah ceremony.

BUTLAND advised that it is possible that MARIAN CARROLL may have been in contact with her brother, JACK RUBY, from his home in Denver, Colorado, during one of her visits here.

RUTLAND advised further that he recalls that in 1944, or 1945, when he was passing through Chicago, Illinois, when he was in the military service, he visited RUBY's parents' home; however, he does not recall RUBY being there or seeing him.

He stated further that besides MARIAN CARROLL, he believes RUBY has a married sister, EVA, last name unknown, with whom he is associated in business in Dallas, Texas; a married sister, EILEEN, last name unknown, who he believes resides in Chicago, Illinois, and a married sister, ANNE, last name unknown, who is believed to reside in Chicago, Illinois. He continued that to bis knowledge JACK RUBY has three brothers, HYMAN RUBEN-STEIN, address unknown; EARL RUBENSTEIN, believed to reside in

RUTLAND advised that he is unable to speculate on any reason that JACK RUBY might have had for shooting LEE HARVEY OSWALD except possibly grief over the death of President KENNEDY. He continued that he has no knowledge of any un-American views held by JACK RUBY and he stated he is unable to furnish any additional information concerning this matter.

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
