Continental Bus Lines, Brownsville, Texas, negative re travel by OSWALD on 9/16/63. Records Mexican Immigration, Matamoros, Tamps., Mexico, negative on travel by OSWALD, wife, and mother. Investigation at Trans-Texas Airways, Avis Rent-a-Car, Continental and Greyhound Bus Lines, all Laredo, Texas, negative for OSWALD on 10/3/63. American Consul, Nuevo Laredo, Mexico, furnished list supplied Consul reflecting identity of persons who entered Mexico at Nuevo Laredo, Mexico, on 9/26/63; and those who exited from there on 10/3/63 by bus and by unknown type of transportation. List set out. S. MOCZYGEMBA picked up hitch-hiker on or about 10/5/63 near San Antonio whom he believes may have been OSWALD. Results of investigation of OSWALD's alleged presence in New Braunfels, Texas, on 11/14/63 set out. OSWALD's name may have been on an envelope of JAMES D. ALLRED, JR., described by former wife as possessing radical belief re Cuba. Miscellaneous information alleging possible data re OSWALD set out.

Mr. GUTIERREZ advised that the company maintains two separate records on all passengers, one being a manifest and the other a separate name card. He stated that the number of cards was the same as the number of names on the manifest and that therefore all passengers which boarded the Trans-Texas flights on October 3, 1963, were properly recorded.

The bus that leaves Mexico City at 1:00 p.m. arrives in Nuevo Laredo, Mexico, at 2:00 p.m. the next day.

CONTINENTAL TRAILWAYS BUS, 919 Houston, Laredo, Texas, has buses departing Laredo, Texas, for Dallas, Texas, at 7:25 a.m., 11:00 a/m., 3:45 p.m., and 4:45 p.m. The trip to Dallas takes 12 hours.

GREYHOUND BUS, 302 Convent, has buses departing Laredo, Texas, for Dallas, Texas, at 3:00 a.m., 7:15 a.m., 11:15 a.m., 2:00 p.m., 4:40 p.m., and 9:15 p.m. The trip to Dallas by GREYHOUND takes 12 hours.

CONTINENTAL TRAILWAYS BUS and GREYHOUND BUS do not maintain passenger lists, and no one at either bus line recalls OSWALD having boarded a bus on October 3, 1963.

Mexican Immigration, and ROBERTO MORALES, Chief of Mexican Customs, had the list prepared and have advised that it is a complete list of persons entering Mexico at Nuevo Laredo on 9/26/63. This list is being set forth by State. The address of the person entering is available only in those cases where the person entered by automobile and was the owner or person entering the automobile into Mexico. (Example: four or five persons could enter in the same automobile but only the owner or person driving or entering the automobile would be recorded in the Customs records with the complete name and address.) All the others, however, would appear in the Mexican Immigration records: FM-8 tourist permits are valid for 6 months. FM-5 are valid for 15 days.
