## INTIRIAL SECURITY - R - CURA

De February 19, 1964, WY T-1, who has furnished reliable information is the past, advised that Marina Gewald, wife of the accused assassin, 100 Marvey Gewald, and her party stayed at the <u>Willard Hotel</u>, Peansylvania Avenue and 16th Street, N.W., Washington, B.C., Guring the recent period when she testified before the Presidential Commission on the Assassination of President Kennedy. By her party, WF T-1 meant Let child, a nurse, Secret Service Agents, a Nr. John meant her child, a nurme, Secret Service Agents, a Nr. John Thorne, and a Mr. Jim Martin. W7 7-1 stated that Thorne was reported to him as her lawyer, while Martin described himself

to W7 T-1 at her business manager. W7 T-1 stated that the Abraham Lincoln Suite had Been arranged for Mrs. Oswald through the United States Secret Service; that this suite consists of rooms 301-2 and room 345. He explained that the suite is entered from the hotel hallway into a small alcove or hallway; that off this alcove to the Left is room 345 with two bods, and to the right 301 and 302, a combination bedroom and adjoining living room space. The two bedrooms face each other across the common alcove. Entrance to the suite, however, can only be gained through the common entrance from the hotel ballway. Occupants of the Buite control access through this common entrance as well as

to the individual rooms within the suite. WF T-1 advised that registration E4246 in the name of Tom Kelley, Secret Service, was arranged for Marina Oswald for rooms 301-2 of the suite. A date stamp disclosed she registered at 9:23 a.m. on February 2, 1964. A date stamp also revealed her departure from the hotel at 9:41 a.m. on February 9, 1964.

wy T-1 advised that registration Matel is the of Tom Keller, Secret Service, "Pevealed that Foom 845 was assigned to mnamed Secret Service Agents; that a date stamp indicated registration at 9:23 s.m. on Tebruary 2, 1964. A Lacidation registration at 9:23 a.s. on February 7, 1964 date stamp on the reverse indicated that departure was at 12:53 y.m. on February 7, 1964. WI Tol advised that Foom 345 was occupied by two Secret Service Agents; that registrations 24286 and 24285 pertain to these two agents and actually are clarifications registration 24247. WE Tol advised that Restants Secret Service Agents; that registrations parce and maxed pertain to these two agents and actually are clarifications of registration Z4247. W7 7-1 advised that Registration Number M236 in the name of Villiam Carter, Little Book, Arkansus, revealed he socupied room 345. WY T-1 said that Mrs. Osvald's registration revealed that she did not check out according to a departure stamp thereon until 9:41 a.m. On February 9, 1964.

V7 T-1 said that registration number B4310 in the name of Jim Hartin, 11611 Farrar, Dallas, Texas, revealed a stamped arrival of 8:00 p.m., February 2, 1964. According to this record, Martin was originally assigned room 633. He pubsequently moved to room 625.

departure stamped on the reverse of the registration form is 2:02 p.m. on February 9, 1964.

WF T-1 said that registration card E4311 for John M. Thorne, 302 W. College, Grand Prairie, Texas, revealed a date stamp showing he checked in at 8:01 p.m. on February 2, 1964. Thorne was originally assigned to room 632, moved to room 618

Although there is no time Stamp on this Slip, WF T-1 said the change was undoubtedly at the Same time as Martin's Since the Same clerk'S name appears on both slips. The time of departure Stamped on the registration card reverse is 2:02 p.m., February 9, 1964. No further change of rooms was indicated for Marina Oswald, Martin or Thorne, WF T-1 said.

WF T-1 said that the Presidential Commission was billed for expenses of Mrs. Oswald until the departure of the Secret Service Agents on February 7, 1964. Her subsequent expenses of about \$95.00 were billed to: Mr. Jim Martin, Box 1407, Prairie, Texas. Therme's entire expenses were billed in the Same Manner.

He remarked to no unrecalled Secret Service Agent that Mrs. Oswald secred to be emanored with Martin, and the latter remarked, as if in agreement, that be felt sorry for Martin's absent wife. MF T-1 said the housekeeper who handled the suite in question said that Martin and Mrs. Cowald always meened to be fogether whenever she was around the suite. WF T-1 said he had no further information in this respect. He did moniton that Martin was unite attentive to her child while they were at the hotel, but thought part of this was for publicity effect.

W? T-1 said be had received no complaints whataoever pertaining to Mrs. Oswald's stay at the botel. He said that a complaint of any nature would have been brought isobdiately to his attention.
