Dear Mr. Lesar:

This is in reply to your letter of May 9, 1975, concerning the records of the Warren Commission.

We have made a search in relevant files of the Commission for the records in which you are interested. We are sending you separately copies of (1) a report of the FBI Laboratory to Chief of Police Jesse E. Curry of Dallas, Texas, dated November 23, 1963, relating in part to the spectographic analysis of items of evidence, and (2) pages 162-165 of Commission Document 5, which duplicate the text of the FBI Laboratory report of November 23, 1963. We are also sending you copies of the following documents relating to the neutron activation analysis of items of evidence of the Commission: (a) a letter of December 11, 1963, of Paul C. Aebersold, Director, Division of Isotopes Development, Atomic Energy Commission, to Assistant Attorney General Herbert J. Miller, Jr. (2 p.); (b) a letter of January 2, 1964, from the Chairman of the Commission to Chairman Glenn T. Seaborg of the Atomic Energy Commission (1 p.); (c) a letter of January 7, 1964, from Mr. Seaborg to the Chairman of the Warren Commission (1 p.); (d) a letter of January 7, 1964, from J. Lee Rankin to J. Edgar Hoover (1 p.); (e) letters of Hoover to Rankin of January 10, 1964 (1 p.), March 10, 1964 (Commission Exhibit 2455; 2 p.), March 18, 1964 (Gallegher Exhibit 1; 2 p.), and September 8, 1964 (1 p.); (f) a memorandum of July 2, 1964, from Norman Redlich to Allen W. Dulles (1 p.); and (g) a memorandum of September 5, 1964, from Melvin A. Eisenberg to Norman Redlich (1 p.).

Our search did not include the testimony of the Commission. If you will cite any testimony in the <u>Hearings</u> of the Commission in which you are interested, we can locate the relevant transcripts of the Commission. We would be pleased to make records of the Commission available to you in the National Archives if you wish to do any additional searching.
