

ORDER

Plaintiff Weisberg has moved for reconsideration of the order of this Court granting summary judgment to the defendants. The motion rests on three premises: first, that Special Agent Paul Stombaugh allegedly examined the collar front of the shirt President Kennedy was wearing when he was assassinated; second, that numerous pages of neutron activation data remain to be furnished to plaintiff, and third, that no FBI agent has stated under oath which FBI files have been searched or that all relevant FBI files have been searched, in connection with plaintiff Weisberg's Freedom of Information Act request. The opinion filed with the order granting summary judgment addressed each of these points, and neither plaintiff's instant motion nor the submissions accompanying it suggests that the opinion need be expanded upon here. Accordingly, it is by the Court this 31<sup>st</sup> day of October, 1977,

ORDERED, that Plaintiff's Motion for Reconsideration, made pursuant to Rules 52(b) and 59 of the Federal Rules of Civil Procedure, be, and hereby is, denied.
