OPPOSITION TO APPELLANT'S MOTION FOR AN ORDER TO SHOW CAUSE

For several reasons, appellees respectfully oppose appellant's motion for an order to show cause why they should not be held in . contempt of this Court for failing to pay the award of \$693.81 in costs.

First, in view of this Court's transmittal of the judgment in lieu of mandate to the District Court on June 6, 1980, it is now apparent that jurisdiction over this case has been transferred back to the District Court. Accordingly, this Court is without jurisdiction to entertain appellant's complaint over nonpayment of costs. Second, the Finance Office of the United States Attorney's Office has just submitted to the corresponding office in the Department of Justice a voucher, a copy of which is attached, which should result in prompt payment of the award of costs. Third, although the delay that has occurred is regrettable, we note that the Assistant United States

Attorney primarily responsible for handling this case on appeal left the office and entered private practice several months prior to the judgment of this Court, and that the matter was apparently not reassigned. Since the judgment and remand, another attorney in the Department of Justice has assumed responsibility for handling defense of this matter. As a consequence, the matter of costs unfortunately escaped being placed in normal channels for payment until now.

WHEREFORE, appellees respectfully request that appellant's motion for an order to show cause be denied.
