Informant has furnished both reliable and un-reliable information in the past. Unreliable information in the category of unverifiable rumor and speculation on informant's part.

Informant stated that several weeks ago he talked with BUNDY who is a fellow prisoner and the person who testified that he saw CLAY SHAW pass money to someone at the Lake front. BUNDY indicated that he had been offered a deal by GARRISON if he would testify to a story about SHAW. This supposedly took place several weeks ago in Parish Prison and before BUNDY testified. BUNDY was undecided but told informant and others that he would do anything to get out of his sentence. BUNDY indicated in so many words without coming out and stating directly that his testimony was not true and a story given to him to tell.

Informant further advised he has been approached by SALVATORE PANZECA and BOB WILSON (former Agent) with respect to testifying to this on behalf of CLAY SHAW. PANZECA is a member of the firm representing SHAW.

Informant further stated that in about January, 1967 JOHN LOISEL member of GARRISON's staff drove down Dauphine Street and pointed out a white house with a red door and asked him if he could get into the house and out and put something in it without being detected. Informant declined and was told that it had something to do with the KENNEDY assassination and that the residence was that of SHAW. Informant was not told what he was to do in the house or place in the house. He was given the DA office Confidential number of 822 2184. This was changed and he was given the present number of 822-0584 through which he could contact the DA.

Informant furnished the above information on his own volition and asked nothing in return. IT SHOULD BE NOTED THAT NOT ALL OF HIS INFORMATION IS RELIABLE AND HE EXAGGERATES AND HAS COME UP WITH THE "BIG STORY" ON OTHER OCCASIONS.

These letters outline various strategh and investigation conducted by MARCELLO's attorneys in connection with the trial of MARCELLO at NO. It is known that FERRIE was in Guatemala during the month of October, 1963 and possibly early November, 1963; and FERRIE was closely associated with the MARCELLO attorney at the time of the trial of MARCELLO at NO.

The 1A envelope which once contained the copies of the above material has a notation of 5/17/67 that the copies were furnished the USA by SA CARNEY and SA KENNEDY.

On February 13, 1964, Raymond Comstock, New Orleans Police officer assigned to the District Attorney's office, advised that shortly after the assassination of President John F. Kennedy he was conducting an investigation to locate David W. Ferrie who was alleged to have been an associate of Leo Harvey Oswald. In connection with this investigation he attempted to locate Ferrie at his residence and in the course of his investigation at Ferrie's residence, 3030 Louisiana Avenue Parkway, he found the following material:

Two undated letters addressed to Mr. Jack Wasserman, Warner Building, Washington, D. C., signed D. W. Ferrie, bearing the return address of Room 307, Maya Excelsior, Guatemala. (It should be noted that the only difference in these letters is that one copy has handwritten corrections and notations on page 2);

An undated letter, addressed to Jack and signed Dave;

An undated letter, addressed to Sr. Jose Luis La Roca, Guatemala; and

First page of David W. Ferrie's bank book with the Whitney National Bank of New Orleans.

Mr. Comstock advised that this material was obtained without a warrant and the search was not conducted incidental to an arrest as Ferrie was not present at his residence and was not located until several days subsequent to his investigation at this address. Mr. Comstock advised that he made copies of above material which he made available on February 13, 1964.

1. The Board of Directors was looking for a chairman who enjoys some prestige. Former Senator Thomas Dodd, of Connecticut, was briefly considered for the role.
 2. The committee had been turned down for tax exempt status.
 3. The committee's bank account balance was \$365.00.
 4. Senator Ted Kennedy was described as "brutally opposed to what we are doing."
 5. Committee members believe that a conspiracy existed in the assassination of President Kennedy, Rev. Martin Luther King, Senator Robert Kennedy, and they also questioned the circumstances of the recent death in Nigeria, an apparent reference to the drowning death of Whitney Young, former head of the Urban League, who was attended on that occasion by former Attorney General Ramsey Clark.

 committee members would be interested in having Special Agent James P. Hosty, of the Kansas City Office, furnish information to one of their members which they assume he has withheld concerning the "true relationship" between Lee Harvey Oswald and the Bureau.

700 [REDACTED] committee members are interested in certain investigative reports of Special Agent Robert P. Gemberling, of the Dallas Office, (referred to as Bob Gimberly) some of whose reports concerning the assassination of President Kennedy were not published by the Warren Committee.

It is suggested that the Kansas City and Dallas Offices alert SA's HOSTY and GEMBERLING to the fact that they might be approached by individuals acting on behalf of captioned committee.

700 It is the evaluation of this office [REDACTED] [REDACTED] that the captioned committee is composed of a number of anti-establishment paranoids with an innate distrust of our system of government.

CARLOS MARCELLO

David W. Ferris is a former pilot for Eastern Airlines and according to Raymond Comstock is a notorious homosexual in the City of New Orleans. Ferris was observed during the course of the trial of Carlos Marcello during the month of November, 1963, to be in frequent contact with defense attorneys G. Wray Gill and Jack Wasserman. Gill and Wasserman were Carlos Marcello's principal defense attorneys.

David W. Ferris when interviewed by New Orleans FBI Agents in connection with another investigation on November 25, 1963, admitted that he has been employed by Attorney G. Wray Gill since March, 1963, and admitted working from August, 1963 to November, 1963 on the case involving Carlos Marcello who had been charged in Federal Court in connection with a fraudulent birth certificate.

Ferris admitted visiting Guatemala on October 11, 1963, and departing Guatemala October 18, 1963, and entering Guatemala on October 20, 1963, and departing November 1, 1963. This information is confirmed by U. S. Passport number E035360 that Ferris exhibited when being interviewed by Bureau agents on another matter on November 25, 1963.

David W. Ferris is identical with New Orleans Police Department number 137026. He was born in Cleveland, Ohio, on March 28, 1913, is 5'11", weighs 195 pounds. He is bald and wears a home-made wig. Ferris's police Department record does not reflect a conviction.
