MEMORANDUM OF POINTS AND AUTHORITIES

The April 15, 1982, affidavit of FBI Special Agent John N. Phillips states that Dallas Field Office file 89-43-1A81 is denied plaintiff on the grounds that it is protected by Exemption 3 and the Copyright Act, 17 U.S.C. § 101 et seq. See Phillips Affidavit ¶3(g). Although Agent Phillips does not describe the record, it appears that it is the famous "Zapruder film", a home movie of the assassination of President Kennedy which is perhaps the most important single piece of evidence pertaining to the President's murder.

The status of allegedly copyrighted materials under the Freedom of Information Act was discussed by the District of Columbia Circuit in a case of first impression, Weisberg v. U.S. Dept. of Justice, 203 U.S.App.D.C. 242, 631 F.2d 824 (1980). The Court held that copyrighted materials may constitute agency records under FOIA. Id., 203 U.S.App.D.C. at 246, 631 F.2d at 828. It also held however, that joinder of the copyright holder under Rule 19(a) of the Federal Rules of Civil Procedure should have been sought. Id., 203 U.S.App.D.C. at 246-249, 631 F.2d at 828-831.

Accordingly, this Court should order defendants to seek the joinder of any copyright holders of materials withheld under claim of copyright unless said copyright holders agree to the release under FOIA of the materials in which they hold a copyright.
