


SUPPLEMENT TO HAROLD WEISBERG'S AFFIDAVIT OF OCTOBER 4, 1982, in CIVIL ACTION
75-0322/0420 CONSOLIDATED

1. In the above-cited affidavit and in earlier affidavits I state that in his declarations FBI SA John Phillips attempts to deceive and mislead the Court regarding the pictures of various kinds at issue. I state that he is deliberately evasive in limiting what he attests to is not "contained" in the "field offices."
2. The day after I executed the cited affidavit, I saw for the first time the declaration of August 16, 1982, that Phillips provided defendant, his employer, in C.A. 82-0755. In it he admits that the pictures of the two field offices are at FBIHQ. He was attesting to a search for pictures sought in C.A. 82-0755. He did not intend this admission, but in attesting that a single FBI employee, without travel, examined the pictures of FBIHQ and the Dallas and New Orleans field offices, he does admit that these field office pictures are at FBIHQ.
3. I also state that the FBI had multiple photographic copies of all the evidence given to the Warren Commission. Phillips, who, as usual, neither claimed nor suggested any first-person knowledge in his inflated calculations, did not state whether they include the many duplicates.
4. In the course of searching my files for another purpose, I came upon a February 10, 1964, internal FBIHQ memorandum. It is in the FBIHQ assassination, Oswald and Ruby main files. It states that one photographic copy of these multiple photographs of all the evidence given to the Warren Commission was to "serve as the Dallas file copy."
5. This leaves it beyond doubt that all these photographs, whether or not now "contained in" the Dallas Field Office, are records of the field office.
6. It is because Phillips knew, as I had attested, that the field office records had been loaned to FBIHQ, and as I also attested, they nonetheless remain field office records, that he resorted to the deliberate evasion and deception of limiting himself to what after this loan is physically in the field offices. It is because I caught him in this trickery that he has failed to dispute my attestation in any way.
