
Enclosed is a copy of the Agreement signed by you and Mr. Weisberg. Mr. Weisberg had no objection to the modifications you suggested.

I am also enclosing a copy of Mr. Weisberg's November 24, 1982 letter to me. The third and fourth paragraphs of his letter explain what he wants to accomplish by having individual slides or transparencies made of the original film and how this can be done without damaging the film or even removing it from its present location.

Mr. Weisberg is 70 years old and has been in ill-health for the past several years. He suffers from phlebits and circulatory problems. Two years ago he nearly died as a result of an arterial blockage which shut off circulation to his left leg and caused him to undergo a second bypass operation. In view of his situation, time is of the essence, and he would greatly appreciate it if you could expedite his obtaining slides or transparencies of the original film.
