ADDITIONAL AFFIDAVIT OF HAROLD WEISBERG ON FBI'S INTENT NOT TO CONDUCT THE SEARCHES REQUIRED IN THIS CASE

1. In prior affidavits I have attested that the FBI never intended to conduct good-faith searches in this case and never did; that it claimed full compliance knowing its claim was false once it processed the few files to which it undertook to limit me without having made any search; and that subsequently the FBI, still without searching, provided only some of what the appeals office directed ^{it} to process.

2. In more recent affidavits I have attested that the FBI does not require any discovery from me to be able to make good-faith searches, albeit such searches would be five years late; and that this discovery is really intended for ulterior and improper purposes.

3. FBI records recently disclosed to another litigant in a lawsuit in which SA John N. Phillips also is the FBI's FOIA supervisor, as he is in this instant cause, are among the new evidence reflecting the FBI's scheming against me and its more successful scheming against the now defunct House Select Committee on Assassinations (HSCA).

4. Among the records pertinent in this instant cause that the FBI continues to withhold is the New Orleans inventory of its main file holdings. It disclosed this inventory to the other litigant and, as I expected, that inventory indicates the existence of other and pertinent information that was neither searched for nor provided.

5. As I previously informed the Court, based on my long and detailed inquiry, my extensive experience and my examination of hundreds of thousands of once-withheld FBI records, the name of the FBI's game in political cases is control; its first

law is "cover the Bureau's ass" and its second law is cover your own ass. These newly disclosed records show how the FBI tries to (and in this case succeeded in) exercising control over a committee of the Congress; how it covered the Bureau's ass in what it withheld; how the field offices covered themselves when they knew investigation was pending; and how the FBI continues to make sport of the Courts in these political cases.

6. Prior to the establishment of HSCA I forced the FBI's hand with regard to its political assassination files with a number of filed and pending lawsuits, including C.A. 75-1996, which is for information pertaining to the King assassination and its investigations, and C.A. 75-226, which is for the results of certain scientific testing in the JFK assassination investigation. As a result of FBI stonewalling those cases are still before the courts.

7. Instead of searching to respond to the specific items of my actual King request, FBIHQ decided arbitrarily and capriciously to process instead its single main file known by the code name "MURKIN." It did this knowing that most of the information I requested would not be filed under MURKIN. It thus succeeded in extorting great wastes in time and money from that Court, my counsel and me and ^{IV} still not complying with requests first made more than a decade ago.

8. The FBI knew very well that in time it would be required to make large JFK assassination records disclosures and that its disclosures would be to private persons like me and to committees of the Congress. It therefore decided on the minimum disclosure it could expect to get away with pulling off. This is reflected in Exhibit 1, the FBI's internal record of November 29, 1976.

9. This record is not new to me. As is reflected on the face of it, a copy is in the King file disclosed to me in that other litigation, C.A. 75-1996. In jazzing it up and making entirely unnecessary and unjustified excisions, Phillips and the FBI withhold in that Court what they earlier disclosed to it in my case and what is publicly available in the FBI's reading room. The silliness is further

illustrated by the fact that what is withheld is also disclosed at several points in the same record. What is withheld is the MURKIN title and its number, 44-38861.

10. The three JFK assassination files to which HSCA was limited are the very ones the FBI tried to limit me to in this instant cause even though before any compliance at all I notified its then counsel that providing those files only would not and could not comply with my requests. However, the FBI did get away with limiting the Committee's file-wide access to these few main files because my litigation exceeded the life of that committee and no records reflecting any additional main file transfers for the committee have been disclosed.

11. The FBI also tried to limit its general JFK assassination disclosures to the records it was making available to HSCA, thus seeking to frustrate other requesters and keep control over the information it disclosed. With the committee, the press and with others, the FBI got away with this scheme. With me it did not. It was required to disclose additional main files, those on Marina Oswald and Jack Ruby among them. These are obvious omissions in the FBI's scheme disclosed first in Exhibit 1. It also was required to provide me with its "enclosures behind files" or bulky exhibits, which it had gotten away with withholding from others. And in this instant cause, still without making the required initial searches, the FBI has been compelled to provide four or five times the number of files to which it limited itself initially, precisely as it does with HSCA in Exhibit 1.

12. The correct FBI filing procedure is reflected on Exhibit 1, a copy of which was made for filing in each of the main files involved. Those who operate the FBI's memory hole, however, appear to have perceived that correct filing would disclose what the FBI did not want to disclose, so thereafter, with almost no exceptions in at least 118 instances, copies were kept out of the main files in which they belong.

13. In the King case, FBIHQ received 59 responses, one from each of its 59 field offices. With a single exception of one case of honest filing, that of the Chicago response, all the King responses are excluded from the main King file. When I asked the FBI for the other field office responses, because the FBIHQ initial directive also was kept out of the main file the FBI could - and did - get away with a direct lie - that there were no other such records and inventories. Finally, five years later, kicking and screaming all the while, the FBI finally disclosed the incredible number of a total of 402 pages of inventories only of its field office records on and about Dr. King.

14. To assure itself that nobody disclosed the existence of records other than the four main files listed in Exhibit 1, FBIHQ on November 26, 1976, teletyped all its offices the strictest instructions not to say a word in response to any congressional inquiry. (Exhibit 2) Although this record pertains clearly to the FBI's JFK and King assassination records, the FBI does not reflect filing of it in any of those main files in all of which copies of it belong.

15. After requesting the King Inventories on November 24, 1976, FBIHQ requested the field offices' JFK assassination records inventories in its teletype of January 5, 1977 (Exhibit 3). Although the subject is clearly the JFK assassination investigation, this copy, also disclosed to the other litigant in another case, does not reflect any filing in any of the main JFK assassination files in each of which a copy should have been filed under FBI filing practices and procedures.

16. While in this teletype FBIHQ appears to be requesting that each field office inventory all pertinent information, FBIHQ is quite careful to say exactly the opposite and to limit the information each field office will provide. Aside from the Jack Ruby and Marina Oswald files each field office is directed to limit its response to the listed same three main files.

17. Those not cued in on FBI lingo and practises might take the language of this directive to include all tapes and other evidence, but as the field offices knew immediately, causing at least two some concern (for their own asses in the coming investigation), FBIHQ was instructing them not to inventory all their tapes and other such evidence but to cite only any in the main files to which FBIHQ limited the field offices.

18. The Dallas response (Exhibit 4) includes the Dallas volunteering of information specifically excluded in the FBIHQ directive. But without providing that information, Dallas risked considerable trouble. Phillips et al, however, tried to overcome this little problem, as they did earlier with me, by their entirely improper withholdings in the copy provided in the other litigation. This is to say that in 1983 Phillips and the FBI are still naming phony (b)(2) and (7)(D) claims to withhold information that has nothing to do with either FBI personnel practises or confidential informants. Even for Phillips, who has yet to deny that he swears to anything and gags at nothing, this is a little careless, because I compelled disclosure of the same information when he and the FBI withheld it from me in this instant cause.

19. Exhibit 5 is the less expurgated copy the FBI was required to provide me. It discloses that what Phillips et al withheld under these phoney claims to exemption is precisely the information FBIHQ wanted to hide and the field offices feared hiding with Congressional investigation pending. Dallas did not dare take any chances because the fact of the existence of all the information Phillips et al withheld is disclosed in the assassination main files. These are among my sources. They provided all the information I required to compel disclosure of these lied-about withheld records. As can be seen, the information Phillips et al withheld under these phoney (b)(2) and (7)(D) claims includes the Dallas warning that all is already disclosed in the main files to which HSCA was to have access. "Pertinent information contained in them was included

in a report dated March 23, 1964" and filed in both Dallas and FBIHQ Oswald main files. It is obvious that this information has nothing to do with either FBI personnel practices or confidential informants, but with such claims Phillips and the FBI withhold from the other litigant and the other Court what they were compelled to disclose to me two years ago and is in the FBI's reading room.

20. New Orleans faced the same problem and solved it in a different manner while still making a strictly literal response to the FBIHQ directive. New Orleans knew that it, too, had pertinent tapes and other records of electronic surveillances that it did not have in the specified main files. However, it did have them, HSCA could learn it and New Orleans had to cover itself. It used the same device the Washington office employed in covering itself because it knew it had embarrassing King records not included in the FBIHQ's directive. Not quite as explicitly as Washington, New Orleans specified at the outset of its response that it had pertinent records not asked for by FBIHQ. (Exhibit 6) Here again the FBI avoided filing the record in any of the assassination main files in each of which a copy belongs. New Orleans likewise failed to file a single copy in any of its assassination main files. Phillips and the FBI have steadfastly refused to provide a copy in this instant cause even though a copy belongs in each of the listed New Orleans main files all of which, the FBI claims, have been disclosed to me in this instant cause.

21. Once New Orleans informed FBIHQ that its response "recapitulates the main files only on cases and subjects cited by number" by FBIHQ, New Orleans was off the hook. This is its clear and unequivocal statement that it has other pertinent information but that it is not in the main files listed by FBIHQ. Among these records New Orleans had and knew were pertinent, although automatically eliminated by the cute FBIHQ directive, are electronic surveillances of and including Jim Garrison and me. Neither Phillips nor anyone else speaking for the FBI has even claimed to have made any search for any of these existing and pertinent records. In another lawsuit in

which Phillips also is supervisor the FBI has disclosed New Orleans electronic surveillance records on Garrison. It thus ought not be outside of Phillip's knowledge that such records exist and are pertinent. The FBI also has not reported any search to locate and provide the record of electronic surveillance on me even though I have provided proof that it exists.

22. The New Orleans Ferrie records identified in my affidavit of March 1 are among the other pertinent and withheld New Orleans material, withheld even from the search slips.

23. The FBI has been silent since I notified it of the special secure Dallas repository for special evidence like various kinds of films and tapes, disclosed in its inventory (Exhibit 5, page 2.) No search is even claimed to have been made. And, as is obvious, no discovery from me is necessary for any of these unmade searches to be made five years after they were required to have been made under the Act.

24. No search slip has been provided reflecting any search for a single piece of film or tape of any kind. Once I provided the identification of the special secure location for such storage in Dallas, as I did months ago, certainly no additional discovery is required for any search at all to be made there, but none has been. Despite all the proof I provided of their existence, no search slip pertaining to the Dallas police tapes has been provided.

25. Phillips and his associates on what amounts to the FBI's FOIA wrecking crew often withheld just for the hell of it and perhaps as a means of making it appear that the interests of the nation require extensive withholdings when this just is not true. In the other litigation in which the FBI is disclosing some of the records pertaining to the HSCA's investigation, they carry this practise past mere ridiculousness.

26. In copying, the second page of Exhibit 3 to my March 2 affidavit was inadvertently omitted. I attach that page here as Exhibit 7. The subject matter and the entire

first paragraph of this internal memo are withheld under no claim to exemption, without the production of any processing worksheets, and with a notation reading only "HSCA." This, certainly, is not a legislated exemption of the Act. And in the next paragraph, with the same claim, the subject matter of the information is actually withheld. As disclosed this sentence reads, "The material being furnished at this time relating to (obliterated) has been previously furnished to requesters under the Freedom of Information Act."

27. Those in the FBI and the Department reading this memo would not have the remotest notion of the subject matter and the involuntariness of the reported public disclosure of the information even the description of which is withheld under claim to "HSCA" exemption. It was not voluntary at all. I began suit for it more than a decade ago and that case is now before the appeals court for the third time in this, its second life. The suit is for the results of certain spectrographic and neutron-activation testing (NAA) of JFK assassination evidence. The 76 pages referred to is hardly all the pertinent information the FBI had. It is merely all that by that time I had compelled it to disgorge. What it then was still withholding from me it also withheld from the Congress, which never did get the additional pertinent records I ultimately did compel the FBI to produce.

28. Whatever purpose Phillips et al had in mind in their withholdings, the judge in that case had no independent means of having the remotest notion of the entirely non-secret and oft-disclosed subject matter. What Phillips et al withhold here is already and for years now has been readily available in the FBI's reading room and in the courthouse.

29. With the same claim to Exemption HSCA, any description of the subject matter that can appear on the second page of this memo (Exhibit 7 hereto) is withheld from that Court and that plaintiff. I recognize the material as pertaining to the NAA

testing, disclosed to me in C.A. 75-226.

30. What happened in that case, the initial reason that it is now before the appeals court for the third time since refiled under the amended Act in 1975, is attributable to the brilliance of FBI SA Thomas H. Bresson of the FOIA section. He guaranteed that this oldest of all FOIA cases would be prolonged indefinitely and compliance precluded also indefinitely, with wasted costs continuing to escalate. He also fills the same role in this lawsuit.

31. Bresson asked my counsel and me to confer with him. Based on my prior experience with the FBI, I was reluctant to attend any conference of which no record would be kept. However, the FBI refused this absolutely, for all the world as though honest people of honest intent have any reason to fear keeping any record of what is agreed to. So, with no record to dispute him, Bresson stated to the Court in C.A. 75-226 what is incredible on its face - that I filed suit for the results of NAA testing only because I didn't want that information and so told him at his "conference."

32. After his initial lie, that I had stated I wanted no NAA results, was wiped out, Bresson et al provided about a dozen and a half pages of information which they then insisted was all that existed. With a subsequent nudge from the appeals court they then disgorged the 76 pages noted in Exhibit 7 and later, after still another appeals court nudge, finally coughed up the printouts that were withheld in their entirety from the Congress.

33. Last in all of this FBI trickery is the incredible fact that it today cannot authenticate the specimens subjected to this testing and the fact that as of today, almost two decades after that most subversive of crimes, it has yet to prepare a comprehensible report on its "scientific" testing.

34. Bresson's genius was invoked in this instant cause, as Phillips admitted in what I earlier described as an atypical fleeting moment of honesty. Instead of following rules and regulations and making searches, when the Dallas and New Orleans

offices received my requests they got in touch with FBIHQ. Without making searches and at FBIHQ Bresson decided, arbitrarily and capriciously, without even being able to make the required searches, what records the FBI limit me to in unauthorized substitution for my actual requests. Not surprisingly, under the Bresson substitute for the Act, the FBI tried to limit me to those main files to which it had limited the Congress and its general FBIHQ assassination releases.

35. Consistent with the foregoing is the FBI's dishonesty in its response to my request for the production of documents. Without shame or embarrassment it actually represents that the first Dallas record pertaining to searches is its June 2, 1978 internal memo on the packing up of those main files to which Bresson tried to limit my request. It is obvious that there must be earlier communications and other records. That date is half a year after my requests. This supposedly very first record reports the presence of the FBIHQ crew at Dallas for packing the records up. And, characteristically, Phillips et al assert a "privacy" claim to withhold the publicly-known names of the agents assigned to this case.

36. Even more impossible is the New Orleans representation that its very first record was not created until August 30, 1978. This supposedly first New Orleans record also was supposed to be its last because it is slugged "RUC", which is FBI slang for "referred upon completion." (This is one of the many representations of complete compliance - without search - limited to the Bresson substitution.)

37. New Orleans also claimed that "All indexed references to all known individuals involved in or referred to in the investigation of the assassination of President JOHN F. KENNEDY were searched through search slips. From analysis of the search slips, all cases in files separate from the main assassination file (89-69) were identified for inclusion in the serial inventory and shipment to FBIHQ."

38. Based on what was provided to me, a larger lie is difficult to imagine.


The FBI has not provided this information, nor has it provided search slips reflecting it. And, of course, the FBI certainly does not require discovery from me for it to provide what New Orleans claims to have sent, all references to all persons involved in or referred to in the investigation.

39. "New Orleans retains the search slips and workpapers" this record states. But no workpapers pertaining to the search were provided, even though they are within the first two items of my request for the production of documents. The reason for non-compliance and untruthfulness is obvious - despite the FBI's oaths what were provided to me are not the originals of the searches. What is referred to as "workpapers" clearly is the originals that were rewritten in what was provided to me as the originals. And, as I state in my March 1, 1983 affidavit, these so-called New Orleans search slips provided to me do not include the Ferrie citations cited in the exhibit attached to that affidavit. Or, as I stated over and over again, they are phoney and no discovery from me is required for the FBI to know that it faked.

40. In order to hide its blatant and deliberate dishonesty from the Court and me the FBI provided unofficial, non-record copies of documents. If it had provided the official Central Records copies the serialization on them would have proven the deliberateness of the FBI's dishonesty in its reply to my request for the production of records. The FBI requires no discovery from me to locate its own record copies or all its pertinent records.

41. There is little doubt that honest compliance with my request for the production of documents would disclose the entire Bresson deception and unauthorized substitution for my requests without any search. The official record copies are serialized, so it would be difficult to withhold from the Court and me because each number must be accounted for. So, I was provided with unserialized, unofficial tickler-type copies.

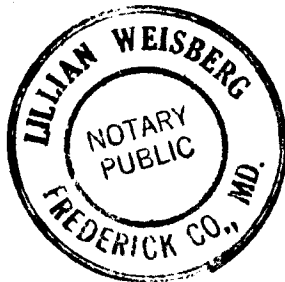
42. All of this again flaunts the FBI's lack of concern for this Court and its integrity and reputation, now and throughout history, for this is, as the Attorney General found, an important historical case, one the appeals court found will be of continuing public interest. For the FBI to be pulling tricks as raw as those I have detailed, including blatant false swearing, with proofs of its dishonesty not even hidden, it has to assume that it will be immune in any offense and will get away with anything. This, certainly, is how scholars of the future will interpret the record the FBI has made for itself and is making for this Court.


